With only a few weeks until the end of the academic year our thoughts turn to plans for the future. I would like to take this opportunity to inform you of a number of staffing changes for next year. We shall shortly be saying a fond farewell and thank you to quite a few members of staff as they move on:

- Mr Watton is leaving our Out of School Provision
- Miss Griffiths (TA) is moving on to higher education
- Mrs Leaf & Mrs Palmer (Midday Supervisors) are moving on
- Mrs Redman (PPA Teacher & Early Years TA) is moving to a new role
- Miss Lamburn (LSA & OOSC) is leaving to start her own business

So, in September, we will welcome Mrs Shrimpton to join Mrs Nelson and Mrs Mills in the Foundation Stage team. These teachers will be supported by Mrs Dale, Mrs Zucconi and Mrs McLoughlin respectively.

Year One classes will be taught by Mrs Beattie, Mrs Brannan and Mrs A. King with Mrs Maddison, Mrs L. King and Mrs Hazel supporting them. Foundation Stage parents had the chance to meet these teachers and find out more about what Year One will bring at a meeting yesterday afternoon.

The Year Two teaching team will be made up of Mrs Spencer, Mrs Tysoe/Mrs Grimsdell and Mrs McNally/Mrs Timms.

Miss Francis will continue in the role of Special Educational Needs Co-ordinator.

Mrs Collins, Miss Francis and Mrs Llewellyn will continue to work in the school providing cover and expert teaching in specific curriculum areas such as music, art and P.E.

Today, Foundation Stage and Year One children will be bringing home a letter informing you of their new class teacher/s for September, so do look out for it in their book bags. Next Friday (7th July) you will receive your child's annual report. Ensuring a smooth transition into, out of and within John Hampden becomes a priority for us now and we are about to start a planned programme of transition arrangements to prepare the children for the next stage in their school journey. We thought you would be interested to know what these activities are so I have included details in the same letter. **We look forward to seeing you and your children at the Open Evening on 13th July.**

2. GOVERNOR SECTION

We talk regularly about the range of opportunities our children are given to learn about people from different cultures and backgrounds, through both physical poster displays around the school and classrooms and through curriculum topics. Importantly, we put a lot of effort into equalities and diversity at the school, and World Week and Cultural Assemblies are just two examples of how we do this.

Feeding into our diversity initiatives are organised visits from relevant community speakers and the incorporation of celebration days into our curriculum to mark religions and traditions such as Chinese New Year, Diwali, Ramadan, Hanukkah, as well as Easter and Christmas. We also tap into the resources provided by The Abbey Centre in Aylesbury to enhance our learning in such areas. The lives of our Services children are highlighted on displays around the school, while activities such as Red, White & Blue Day remind all of our children and families about the wonderful jobs being carried out by those Service families.

By way of background, the Equality Act 2010 sits as the reference point for schools, and indeed wider society, to consider protection of individuals' rights and advancement of equality of opportunity for all. From an equalities and diversity perspective, this underpins everything that we do as a school. Our own 'Equalities and Cohesion Policy' looks at a range of responsibilities under the areas of diversity, equality, and community cohesion, stating our philosophy of valuing the individuality of our pupils, and our commitment to giving all of our pupils every opportunity to achieve the highest of standards.

Importantly, we aim to transform individual and shared circumstances positively, as well as perceptions, attitudes and relations. We aim also to reflect the diversity of our local community and society, and ensure that the education we offer reduces the chances of social divisions by recognising, celebrating and valuing different backgrounds, lifestyles and identities.

Sitting alongside our policy is an action plan, developed between the senior leadership team and governors, which addresses targets across areas such as self-esteem, creativity, social skills, tolerance, respect, initiative, sense of justice, and promotion of the spiritual, moral social and cultural development of our children.

A good example of our equalities initiative in action is our 'Cosy Corner' initiative, where a wigwam has been set up as a quiet and safe area for children to receive pastoral as well as educational support, including access to artefacts reflecting different cultures. This has been warmly received.

Our work goes on, and we believe that such commitments are as important within the context of a school with limited ethnic diversity as they would be in a school with more diverse backgrounds, whatever that diversity may be.

We will make sure doors are opened promptly at 8.45am and hopefully this way we can avoid the congestion that builds in certain areas when people arrive early and have to stand around waiting.

At the open evening on Thursday 13th July we will have a school uniform stall set up for any parent wishing to buy uniform, book bags, P.E kit etc. for the new academic year.

TEA TOWELS

We are getting ready to produce a unique tea towel to sell to our Year Two families as a special memento as their children leave our school. The children are all in the process of drawing an image of themselves which will be included on a Year 2 Leavers tea towel. Once complete this will be printed and will be on sale before the end of term. Look out for more information in due course.

PUNCTUALITY

We are currently experiencing quite a high number of pupils arriving to school late i.e. after the black security gates are shut. We appreciate that occasionally there may be extenuating circumstances, but a late arrival has an impact on the preparation for learning in the classroom.

Pupils should arrive at school between 8.45am and 8.55am.

Pupils arriving late must be brought in by their parent/carer through the main entrance where we ask you to sign them in and provide a reason for their lateness. At this early stage in their education it is important that good habits are formed and we request your support in ensuring your children arrive in good time so there is no impact on valuable learning time. Thank you for your support.

SAFEGUARDING

We have been made aware of an incident at a school in the local area where a pupil was approached at the perimeter fence by a stranger who made inappropriate and indecent comments to him. The incident was reported to the police but we are all being extra vigilant as a result.

4. CURRICULUM

The school has a strong commitment to the added value of learning beyond the school premises. We also take every opportunity to invite visiting groups into school.

Each year we arrange a number of activities that take place off the school site which support the aims of the school.

Next week Year Two pupils will take part in a multi-skills festival at The Mandeville School. This will allow them to join with other Year Two pupils from the local schools in a range of fun sporting activities.

Following the sporting festival, Year Two children will be out again visiting a local farm as part of their science and topic work.

Year One children recently enjoyed a trip to Whipsnade Zoo and we thought you might like to hear more about it. Linked to our Science work on animals, as well as visiting the animals, the children also took part in a "Fur, Feathers and Scales" workshop. This was a really fun 'hands on' session. The children were encouraged to explore the different vertebrate families, to compare and contrast different objects from the natural world from tigers to penguins, and to label and sort the animals into groups. They were even introduced to and were able to touch a real snake! The children clearly enjoyed the trip and on returning to school have produced some fabulous 'animal pattern' art!

I liked it in the butterfly house. We saw lots of bright colourful butterflies—Jack (Squirrels)

The sealions were swimming and doing tricks. I liked watching them—Liyana (Squirrels)

I liked seeing all the animals—especially the crocodiles—Jack (Badgers)

I liked the meerkats—they were funny crawling through their tunnels—Lily (Badgers)

The elephants were so cute! They were playing football—Eleanor (Hedgehogs)

I liked touching the snake! - Theo (Hedgehogs)

7. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

We aim to keep you fully informed of our actions linked to the school improvement plan.

GOAL A: LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

As we come to the end of this academic year we are starting to plan the next actions to improve the school further. We will be taking notice of a range of data, feedback and monitoring and evaluation information to write the objectives for the School Improvement Plan for the next academic year. This allows us to include the views of our pupils, staff, parents, other stakeholders and external validators in our future improvements.

In 2017-2018 our Senior Leadership Team will remain the same—Mrs Barnes, Mrs Parkinson and Mrs Spencer.

GOAL B: QUALITY OF TEACHING, LEARNING & ASSESSMENT

Ensuring we are prepared to provide an engaging and stimulating curriculum has been a priority this year. This will remain the case next year as we continue to make tweaks to the curriculum. At recent staff meetings, we have reflected on the changes that have been made to the content and structure of the curriculum and we look forward to making further creative and exciting improvements for next year.

A revised six week transition timetable is being designed for all pupils from September. This aims to ensure the move from one year group to the next is as smooth and consistent for the children as possible.

GOAL C: PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT, BEHAVIOUR & WELFARE

The arrangements for a smooth transition to the next school year are well underway. The teachers and children will visit their new classes in their new rooms a number of times before the end of term. We currently have over 300 children in the school so on Tuesday 4th July, careful planning is required to ensure pupils moving to Wendover Junior School get there safely, Early Years move to Foundation Stage, Foundation Stage move to Year 1, Year 1 move to Year 2 and new children starting in September were welcomed and sent to their new classrooms. Future Year 1 and Year 2 children are looking particularly grown up now and I am sure they will impress their new teachers with their wonderful attitude to the changes they are facing.

Meetings for parents of children due to start Foundation Stage in September will take place on Monday 3rd July.

GOAL D: PUPIL OUTCOMES

All assessment data has now been submitted to the Local Authority and all statutory deadlines were met. Foundation Stage parents and Year 2 parents will receive information regarding their child's performance in the statutory assessment procedures for these cohorts. We are very pleased with the outcomes of the Foundation Stage assessments for this group of pupils. They are certainly well prepared for the next stage of their education. Year 2 pupils have also made very pleasing progress but it will be some time before we are able to judge our performance to that of other schools locally and nationally. The statutory Phonics check took place for all Year 1 and some Year 2 pupils. Parents will receive their child's individual result with their annual report. Following a considerable amount of work to improve teaching and learning in phonics we are pleased to note that there has been another rise in the percentage of children reaching the required 'pass' mark—keeping us well above previous national results for the fourth time.

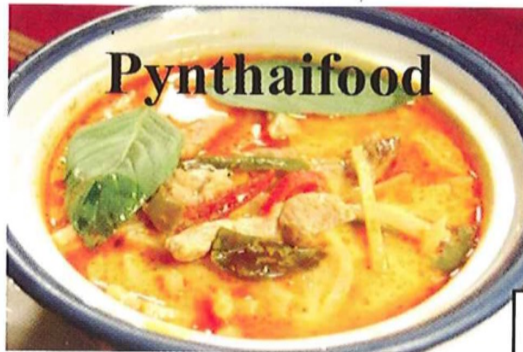

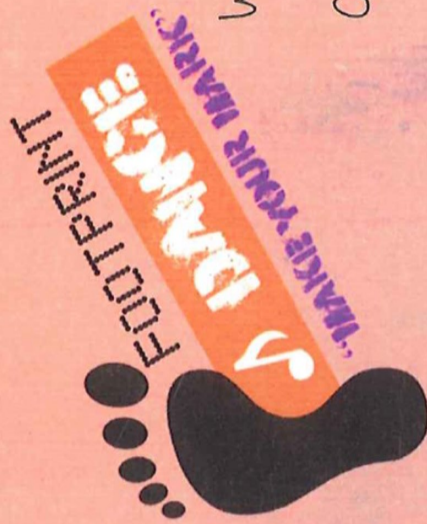
