2. GOVERNOR SECTION

Visit Report to Foundation Stage – 11th October 2016

I visited Mrs Parkinson today who outlined her Action Plan for the School Year 2016/2017. I was pleased to see the Action Plan is comprehensive and will enhance children's learning in the school.

Mrs Parkinson has developed a baseline assessment, specifically aimed to enhance the school's ethos and promote learning experiences for children. I believe the baseline assessment and ongoing tracking provides a firm basis for Foundation Stage, providing every child with an opportunity to progress.

Areas of learning have been purposefully resourced by providing equipment to support and enhance the children's learning. Each area has been thought out providing opportunities for the children to have a 'growth mindset' attitude to learning, enabling them to test themselves and question potential achievement and build their confidence for improvement.

We discussed the school's vision and values, which are taught from a child's first day and adhered to throughout the school. This provides children with continuity and an expectation for them to work towards.

As you are aware, the Foundation Group have two new members of staff. The team are working together to provide the Foundation Children with a stimulating, inviting environment which gives them confidence to try new things. I can see this emerging as I walked around the Octagon and outside areas

The new Foundation Stage children were all engaged in a variety of activities both inside and out. It was lovely to see how well the children have transitioned into the routines of the school. I observed many lovely activities on offer and the majority of the children were in the outside area.

There are some exciting things happening in the Octagon, the computer area is being rearranged into a home corner as the school have new learning pads for the children to use.

We are embarking on our new school improvement plan and displays will soon be starting to develop further around the school to highlight the areas we have chosen to focus on. We are setting ourselves goals which link with the four key aspects of the Ofsted inspection framework —these have been selected as a result of the feedback we have gained from our stakeholders as well as analysis of a great deal of data.

Important Information.

If the weather is particularly wet, stamping will not take place that day - however, the stamping team will ensure your child receives two stamps the following day.

I am also holding a 'Walk to School' week starting on 17th October. This would be an ideal opportunity for your child to start using their new bronze passports. To make their walk to school even more enjoyable, I am attaching a 'Scavenger Hunt' sheet to this newsletter which can be completed as you make your way to and from school. Any completed sheets can then be handed into the class teacher on Friday 21st October.

A raffle like draw will take place after half term of any completed Scavenger Hunt sheets. A prize will be given to one child drawn from each class. Further details can be found on the attachment.

Remember, you don't just have to walk to school, but you could come on your bicycle, scooter or drive part of the way, park away from the campus and then walk the remainder of your journey. Don't forget, the more stamps in the passport, the more prizes can be won.

There are many benefits to walking, scooting or biking to school: it keeps you healthy, there is less traffic on the campus road, making the journey to school much safer for pedestrians and it is good for the environment too.

Our 'Go for Gold' scheme is very important to the school and I am happy to hear from anyone who would like to join our team of stampers.

I would like to remind children that they must wheel their bike or scooter on any of the school's paths and not attempt to ride them once they are inside the school's gates.




