3. IMPORTANT MESSAGES

USING CUTLERY

Since Christmas we have been watching the children as they enjoy eating the hot school lunches. We are noticing that some children are struggling to use a knife and fork correctly. We would like to request your support in encouraging them to use a knife and fork to eat their main course whilst they are with you. They are using adult sized cutlery so it would be good for them to practise this at home too. Thank you.

COMIC RELIEF

P.E KITS

Children with long hair should have it tied back and anyone with earrings should have them removed at home or be provided with tape to cover them during P.E. sessions.

7. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

We aim to keep you fully informed of our actions linked to the school improvement plan. Since the last newsletter we have:-

GOAL A: LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

April is budget setting time for the school and we are in the process of finalising our expenditure for the next academic year. As you are aware the budget situation in Bucks schools is extremely tight and we will need to be prepared to make some very difficult decisions in the next few months. Staff are consulted when preparing the financial plan and governors hope to ensure that it will support the school in achieving its goals for school improvement in order to enhance learning. Mrs Griffiths, our Finance Officer, takes responsibility for the day to day running of the school finances, assisted by the Leadership Team.

GOAL B: TEACHING, LEARNING & ASSESSMENT

The week before the Easter break is 'Assessment Week' and staff have completed a range of tasks and tests with their pupils to measure their progress and to identify the next steps for each child in the key areas of Reading, Writing and Maths.

On Thursday 20th April, Mrs Barnes will hold a meeting for parents/carers to explain the statutory assessment arrangements that are due to take place within the month of May. At the John Hampden School, the children are used to being assessed regularly at all stages of their education, and they are always encouraged to do their best. As a result of the introduction of the new National Curriculum, end of KS1 tests have changed and parents who have older children who completed the old style SATs might be interested to hear and see the differences that have been made. Whilst end of key stage tests are important in evaluating the success of the school, it is essential that we continue to track the progress made by individuals, groups and cohorts throughout their time in the school.

GOAL C: PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT, BEHAVIOUR & WELFARE

On Monday evening we welcomed new parents and pupils into school. The pupils are due to start in our Early Years Class after Easter and they spent two hours with Mrs Griffiths and Mrs Redman before they start in April. To make the experience less daunting, Mrs Griffiths and Mrs Redman have met the children as they visited from their pre-schools/playgroups throughout the second half of term.

Class Council Circle Time has happened again in the past two weeks. This is where each class were asked the same questions and the results were collated. The focus of the discussion this time was behaviour and safety and it has been interesting to read the children's perceptions. Key issues from the Class Council Circle Time have been shared with the School Council who are now deciding how they would like to see the Leadership Team addressing their concerns.

GOAL D: PUPIL OUTCOMES

Tracking pupil progress is a necessary part of monitoring in the school. Each term, following Assessment Weeks, staff give a summative assessment level for each pupil in reading, writing and mathematics. This information is used to track progress from one term to the next. It is then possible for us to identify those children who are making below, expected or above expected progress. For any child that has not made expected progress, teachers are required to identify actions they will take to address any concerns. This careful tracking of pupil progress helps us to maintain the high standards of achievement we have come to expect at John Hampden.

Use of social media

We are writing to you to request your support in ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all members of our community when posting and sharing content on social media sites. if parents wish to set up social media groups in order to get to know other parents and discuss their children then they are strongly advised to do so by setting up private groups and ones which cannot be accessed by other members of the public in order to ensure the safety of their children.

All parents and carers are entitled to have their own views and opinions and schools welcome these comments through the appropriate channels. We would like to ask that all members of our school community consider how comments are sometimes misunderstood when shared online and the possible impact and consequences on others of our online actions.

It is important that all parents and carers understand that the use of social media to deliberately threaten, upset, harass, intimidate or embarrass members of staff or anyone else associated with the schooling community will be considered to be cyberbuilying and/or harassment and will not be tolerated. Posting threatening, obscene or offensive comments online can also potentially be considered as a criminal offence and can therefore have very serious consequences.

Schools in Buckinghamshire will take action against inappropriate postings on social media if they:

- Could have repercussions for the orderly running of the school or
- Pose a threat to another pupil or member of the public or
- III. Could adversely affect the reputation of the school.





If parents/carers have any concerns or complaints regarding their child's school, then we would like to request that they be made using the correct and official channels so we can work together to help resolve any concerns that parents/carers may have. 
