We have spent time in the first few weeks focusing on the Golden Rules and reinforcing our core values so that all pupils are fully aware of our expectations. I regularly visit the

We have a positive approach to behaviour management, and ou Golden Rules highlight what children should do, rather than what they should not! 							
Curriculum	4	We believe it is important to acknowledge when children do well, and at John Hampden, this is done in a variety of ways. Feedback from teaching staff is the most immediate method, but stickers and pebbles are also used as reward tokens in many of the classes. Children are sent to me to share their learning when they have done exceptionally well and I reward this behaviour with special stickers and							
Pupil's Section	5	a gold star to take home. Each Friday we hold a whole school Merit Assembly, in which one child from each class is chosen to receive a Merit Award. This is awarded by the class teacher and teach ing assistant for exceptional behaviour or exceptional learning. Children receiving the Merit Award are invited to sit on special chairs throughout the assembly, and a star is put onto our Merit Board to remind us of their achievement. Our Midday Meals Supervisors also nominate children to receive a special certificate each Friday. A name is picked from a special box and a certificate and sticker is presented to that child. All children who have been nominated will bring home their purple nomination slip and a sticker so you can see what they have done to impress us.

HOT SCHOOL MEALS UPDATE



Many thanks to those parents who took the time to complete the recent Hot Meals survey. The closing date for returning the forms has passed and the data we received is as follows:

Your feedback suggests that the majority of parents would like us to provide a hot meal at lunchtime and so we will now be meeting with representatives from the possible providers to ascertain how quickly this can be implemented. We obviously have to choose the most cost effective solution and there will inevitably have to be some alterations to our current lunchtime arrangements to allow all children who have selected a hot meal to have enough time to be served and to eat it.

We hope to provide some tasting sessions for parents soon, so you can make the decision of whether you will definitely be signing your child up for a hot meal. We will provide you with regular progress updates as we move towards implementing the hot meals.

As I mentioned in the survey letter, once we introduce hot meals we will no longer be providing packed lunches for children, so families who would prefer their children to have a packed lunch will need to provide their own but for now the normal lunchtime arrangements will continue.

The Governing Body are always willing to listen to parental queries and to explain in more detail what the Governing Body does. 3. IMPORTANT MESSAGES

SAFETY ON BICYCLES AND SCOOTERS

During assembly on Monday we will be reminding children that they should refrain from riding their bicycles and scooters within the school grounds. Please would you support us by reminding them to dismount as they come through the gate—no-one should be cycling or scooting in the cycle/storage area. Thank you

NEW FENCING

We have recently had new fencing erected in various parts of the school. We have had a fence and gate installed to prevent pedestrians from exiting up the school drive. Pedestrian and vehicle routes are now clearly signed. For the safety of everyone we would ask you not to walk your children up and down the school drive for any reason.

ADDITIONS TO SCHOOL LUNCHES

As stated in a previous communication to parents, we would ask that you do not send in items of food to supplement the school lunches that are provided. We changed our policy on this at the beginning of this academic year because we were being left with a huge number of uneaten items which we were required to throw away. Parents must opt to either accept the school lunch in its entirety or provide their child's own lunch. If you decide your child no longer wishes to receive the school lunch and you are providing their packed lunch, please can you inform the office so we can cancel the school lunch. Thank you.

DAHLICIOUS DRESS UP DAY

Many thanks for the amazing effort that went into producing costumes for the dress up day last Friday. The children looked truly fantastic (further details in the Pupil's Section) and the staff looked great too. We managed to raise nearly £200 for this marvellous cause.

VOLUNTARY CONTRIBUTIONS

Voluntary Contributions—each term we ask for a voluntary contribution of £10 to help us pay for additional activities that the school budget does not allow us to provide. The contribution is voluntary and no child would miss out if their parents opted not to pay. However, the more contributions we receive, the more we can provide. Providing a termly contribution means that parents will not be asked for several smaller voluntary contributions throughout the term. Contributions should be sent in an envelope via the class teacher or directly to the school office. It is possible to pay £30 for the whole year if this is more convenient. Thank you


Tours at Wendover CE Junior School
