#### 3. IMPORTANT MESSAGES

#### School Times

This is a reminder that pupils should not arrive in school before 8.45a.m each morning. We have noticed a number of children who are at school significantly earlier than this. Pupils may arrive at anytime between 8.45 and 8.55a.m and we hope this slightly staggered start will ease congestion at one of the busiest times of the day. We would also remind parents/carers that they should be at school at 3.15pm to collect their child. We obviously understand if there are unforeseen circumstances that mean you may be late on rare occasions and we will always supervise children if they have to wait. However, we would ask you to make alternative childcare arrangements if late collection is a regular occurrence.

#### Parent Helpers

Please look out for a pink letter in your child's book bag next week. We are seeking help from any parent/carer who may be able to volunteer in school to support reading, cooking, art, sewing etc. We are also seeking help from parents who would be willing to spend the first fifteen minutes of the school day (8.45am -9.00am) supporting children with reading activities.

All volunteers must be prepared to undertake a DBS check as part of our safeguarding procedures.

#### School Bank

Our Foundation Stage parents will soon be receiving information about the School Bank. The Harpenden Building Society visit the school at 1.30pm every Wednesday. The children may open an account and save a small amount each week. If any other child in the school is interested in joining the bank, packs are available in the school office.

#### Tours at Wendover CE Junior School

Parents of children currently in Year 2 are warmly invited to visit Wendover CE Junior School to meet the Headteacher, Mr Mirams, and have a tour of the school led by the Year 6 prefects. To allow them to cater for expected numbers, they ask that you book a place on your chosen session by calling the school on 01296 696822 by Friday 4th November. Tours are available on Tuesday 8th, Wednesday 9th or Thursday 10th November either 1.30pm or 2.15pm.

#### Water Bottles

We do encourage children to bring a water bottle to school each day. This is in addition to their lunchtime drink. Your child will have easy access to their water bottle throughout the day. Children are reminded to take their water bottles home each night to be refilled. Please do not put squash or juice in these bottles as it is less healthy and can also be very sticky! Thank you

#### Food Tasting

You will shortly receive a slip in your child's book bag. At various times throughout the year we do food tasting activities and we need to be sure that we are aware of any allergies. Please complete the slip and return it to school as soon as possible and remember to keep us updated of any changes. Returning the slip will mean we don't have to ask for the information each time a food tasting activity is planned. Please note, we only need to know about specific allergies, not details about food that your child doesn't like!!

#### Nuts

We do have several children in the school with a severe allergy to nuts. We would be grateful if you would refrain from providing nuts in lunchboxes to reduce the risk of allergic reactions. Thank you

#### Naming Belongings

After the first few P.E lessons/ clubs, it is clear that many children have clothing that is not named and this is causing real difficulties for staff. Please would you ensure all belongings are named and that children are aware of where their name is on their things. It is obvious that some children would really benefit from having some extra practise when dressing/undressing independently and keeping their clothing in neat piles, socks in shoes etc. We would really appreciate your support with this.

## <u>Go For Gold</u> 'Walk to school' scheme Stampers needed!

I am very pleased to say that our 'Go for Gold' walking initiative will be starting again this term thanks to two new volunteer coordinators, Mrs Palmer and Mrs Gammans.

We are hoping to launch the scheme in the next few weeks to coincide with 'Health Week' and your child will soon bring home a new bronze passport that can be stamped each morning. Remember, you don't just have to walk to school, but you could come on your bicycle, scooter or drive part of the way, park away from the campus and then walk the remainder of your journey. Don't forget, the more stamps in the passport, the more prizes can be won.

There are many benefits to walking, scooting or biking to school: it keeps you healthy, there is less traffic on the campus road, making the journey to school much safer for pedestrians and it is good for the environment too.

Our 'Go for Gold' scheme is very important to the school and to help it run smoothly I would like to build up a team of volunteer stampers to help stamp the passports in the morning.

The scheme has been running for many years now and we would like to be able to continue, so ideally we would need to recruit at least two volunteers from each class to help. If you have a few minutes to spare when you bring your child to school then I am happy to hear from anyone who would like to join our team. If we have enough volunteers then a rota can be set up, so the more helpers the better.

To ease congestion we will also be setting up different stamping stations for each year group and more information will follow soon.

#### 5. CURRICULUM

This year, as a result of feedback from the children and staff, we are continuing with the changes we made to Golden Time and the 'Scroll of Honour' will, once again, provide opportunities for children to be spotted for doing something special. We have seven Golden Rules that underpin our Behaviour Policy. Children who consistently follow the Golden Rules will be rewarded each Friday afternoon with approximately 45 minutes of 'Golden Time'. This term each teacher has planned a different exciting activity, and during the term each class will rotate through the different activities. Activities include: visiting the Octagon, story activities, craft activities, multi-media, construction and music. Children who have lost some minutes of their Golden Time will spend this time with Mrs Barnes. We hope that these appealing activities will be a real incentive to encourage everyone to follow the Golden Rules.

Within each class we have also included a 'Thinking Mat' which, if necessary, children are asked to sit on to reflect on their behaviour.

All pupils are following a carefully designed 'transition timetable' for the first half of the Autumn Term. We hope that a timetable which allows time for staff to ensure children are settled and getting used to the regular routines and expectations, will be beneficial for all.

Philosophy sessions/activities continue to be a weekly feature. This may sound rather ambitious but children are naturally curious and educational research suggests that encouraging children to ask questions and to listen to other people's ideas helps them to understand their thoughts and how they affect their lives.

It is fascinating to hear the children's thoughts and we find that from one starting point many more questions are posed. The only thing to remember with philosophy is that there are no right or wrong answers— just the opportunity to hear, develop and value different viewpoints.

#### 7. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

As the new academic year begins we are in the process of identifying and planning actions for a new School Development Plan 2016-2017 which aims to guide improvements to the school over this time. We are taking into consideration many factors e.g. stakeholder views expressed in questionnaires and comments, feedback from other outside agencies, data analysis, Government policy etc.

In the next newsletter I will share a summary of the new priorities so you can see what we are aiming to achieve.

However, during the summer holiday and over the next weeks/months, works to improve the school environment are on-going:

- The Early Years class turned into a Year 2 class (many thanks to the RAF for providing us with manpower to make this move easier)
- Fabulous new Interactive boards were installed in all Foundation Stage classes and in Eagles class (funded by the FJH)
- The old hall floor was stripped, sanded and varnished
- Old shelving and reading book storage was removed and replaced with new shelving and book boxes
- Display areas were created in some of the new spaces created by the building work
- A new finance office was created
- Mrs Parkinson's office was completed and she moved in
- The curved wall in the corridor was re-plastered and redecorated
- Designated spaces for KS1 class groups to work outside the classroom were created
- Deep cleaning of the classrooms and shared areas took place
- Two skips were filled!

Valerie Peters, a teaching assistant in Year 2 in Red Kites class has for the last two years been helping her friend organise 200 boxes for Operation Christmas child, through an organisation called Samaritans Purse. They are the largest childrens Christmas project in the world. With the community behind them they have collected, wrapped and fund raised and managed to send all 200 boxes abroad.

This year they need your help. Each year they have knitters who knit hats and gloves. They have fund raised to get all the toothpaste/tooth brushes and flannels for each box. They even have pencils and paper but unfortunately they are short of small cuddly animals and toys for boys and girls aged 4-10 years.


These children have nothing. A little girl was walking around with a stick. When asked why, she said it was her baby. Imagine the joy when she opened her parcel and had a dolly.

#### Sophie Palmer's babysitting service


Hello I'm Sophie and I'm a Mum to 4 little ones, 3 who attend John Hampden School.
