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1. Message from Mrs Barnes

In an infant school, at the beginning of a new school year, I think it is particularly important for the children to be given time to settle into their new classes, getting to know their new teachers and teaching assistants. We have spent time in the first few weeks focusing on the Golden Rules and reinforcing our core values so that all pupils are fully aware of our expectations. I regularly visit the classes during the working day and it is very encouraging to watch the children adjusting to the routines and expectations of school life. We have a positive approach to behaviour management, and our Golden Rules highlight what children should do, rather than what they should not!

We believe it is important to acknowledge when children do well, and at John Hampden, this is done in a variety of ways. Feedback from teaching staff is the most immediate method, but stickers and pebbles are also used as reward tokens in many of the classes. Children are sent to me to share their learning when they have done exceptionally well and I reward this behaviour with special stickers and a gold star to take home. Each Friday we hold a whole school Merit Assembly, in which one child from each class is chosen to receive a Merit Award. This is awarded by the class teacher and teaching assistant for exceptional behaviour or exceptional learning. Children receiving the Merit Awards are invited to sit on special chairs throughout the assembly, and a star is put onto our Merit Board to remind us of their achievement. Our Midday Meals Supervisors also nominate children to receive a special certificate each Friday. A name is picked from a special box and a certificate and sticker is presented to that child. All children who have been nominated will bring home their purple nomination slip and a sticker so you can see what they have done to impress us.

During Merit Assembly we will also be awarding the 'Golden Boot' to the class who have most children walking to school (this is measured by the Passport Stampers in the Going for Gold initiative which is due to start soon)

Bike It Bears are awarded to the classes who have most children cycling/scooting to school and Mrs Beattie also awards prizes to one lucky cyclist and one scooter rider, chosen at random, from the bicycles and scooters left at school on Thursday lunchtime.

A silver cup is awarded to the 'Class of the Week' . So far Caterpillars, Badgers and Squirrels have won the cup - I'll leave your children to tell you who won it today!

Finally, 'The Scroll of Honour' is unfurled. The scroll contains the names of any child in the school who has been spotted by any adult for doing something special. The children are called to the front of the assembly and the whole school sing a congratulatory song to them.

We also like to celebrate achievement outside school and we have a display board in the corridor to showcase the talents of our pupils. If your child is awarded a certificate or an award for swimming, dancing, sport, music etc. we are happy to take a photocopy or photograph and put it up on the board.

Thank you to the large number of you who were able to attend the Growth Mindsets Curriculum Evening last Thursday. We hope you found it interesting and informative. The presentation from the evening can be found under the Parents Section of the school's website.

It was also hugely encouraging to see so many parents attending last week's curriculum evening on Growth Mindsets. The presentations, by Mrs Barnes and Mrs Parkinson, provided an overview of what a Growth Mindset is and how it is being developed at the school. The purpose of these sessions is to help you, as parents, engage in your child's education and I think everyone who attended gained a great deal. As one parent put it so succinctly: 'A very helpful evening allowing us to learn new ways to encourage our children's learning journey.' Personally, the 'practical' element to the evening, where Parents and carers were given practical ideas about how they can encourage a growth mindset with their children, left me with a deep suspicion that I lean more towards a 'fixed' mindset. However, it also provided me with a ray of hope that by embracing imperfections, asking the right questions (and listening to the answers...), and viewing this challenge as an 'opportunity' – I too can nudge the pendulum closer towards the 'Growth' end of the spectrum.

That is, after all, what having a Growth Mindset is all about: abilities can be developed through dedication and hard work... I will be embracing this mindset as I start on my new journey as the Chair of Governors. Wish me luck.

3. IMPORTANT MESSAGES

SAFETY ON BICYCLES AND SCOOTERS

THE RETURN OF 'THE BOOK SWAP'



On Monday 2nd October our Year 2 classes visited The Bucks County Museum & Roald Dahl's Children Gallery in Aylesbury. This term the children learnt all about 'Roald Dahl' linked to our History topic about a famous, local person. They learnt so much about the author and his life and it was fabulous to see and hear the children share all their knowledge with the museum staff as well as learn some more facts they didn't already know! As always, the visit was a huge success and the children were extremely well-behaved modelling our John Hampden School values and following our Golden Rules.

The children completed a workshop in Roald Dahl's Children Gallery. They heard all about the 'disgusterous' Twits in their filthy upside down room; acted out a scene from Charlie and the Chocolate Factory where poor Augustus Gloop fell into the chocolate river and got stuck in the bubble tube; investigated underground treasures by crawling through Fantastic Mr Fox's tunnel; discovered the world of James' Giant Peach; explored sounds with the BFG; boggled their eyes with optical illusions.
