1. Message from Mrs Barnes

Well, we have almost come to the end of another academic year and as this is the final newsletter of the term, I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for all the support you have given the school this year—we are fortunate to have parents who are genuinely interested in their child's learning and supportive of the school in general. As we reflect on the year and the progress that has been made in terms of school improvement, I believe we can congratulate ourselves on another successful year. Back in September we reminded our pupils of our seven core values: belonging, collaboration, perseverance, independence, good manners, reflection and respect and I have spent the year watching these values being demonstrated on a daily basis. Emphasizing these values has helped to further develop our ethos of 'Loving to Learn' and I hope you found the end of year reports reflected the values that are being encouraged.

We have now completed our school development plan for 2017-2018 and I am proud that we have managed to maintain our high academic standards whilst continuing to enhance and improve the quality of teaching and assessment, leadership & management and the quality of personal development, behaviour and welfare we offer.

It is with sadness that we have had to say goodbye to a number of staff and governors during the year and we wish them every success in their new ventures. On Tuesday 24th July we also have to say goodbye to our Year 2 children and their parents —the children have been stars and I am sure they will continue to thrive in their next schools.

I hope you all have a very happy, safe Summer Holiday and I look forward to seeing our new Foundation Stage, Year One and Year Two children back in school between 8.45am and 8.55am on **Thursday 6th September**.

On that morning staff will be on hand to direct you as to which entrances the children should use on the first morning and thereafter. You are, of course, welcome to bring your children in for the first few days but we would ask you to let them come in independently as soon as they are ready.

School finishes at 3.15pm. Foundation Stage parents should collect their children from the same door that they use in the morning. Year One children will be brought to the area where the scooters are currently left and parents of Year Two children should wait in the area by the wooden gate nearest to their classrooms. Children will not be allowed to leave the teacher until they can see the person who is collecting them.

2. GOVERNOR SECTION

As another school year draws to a close it's always tempting to reflect on the year's achievements - and why not!? What a great year it has been for John Hampden.

There really are too many successes to mention them all, but a few that really stand out include: the achievements of the School Council; promoting community links through Wendover Celebrates and Linking School Visits; the success of the new school nursery; achieving well above the national average for various statutory assessments (SATS and Phonics); all the money raised by the school for various charities through 'Red, White and Blue Day', Sports Relief and Enterprise Week, and the money raised by the Friends of John Hampden for the school; and Mrs Barnes' ability to maintain an outstanding level of education and rewarding working environment during such financially challenging times (and whilst half the school ground is a building site!)

Guided by our key values of Perseverance, Independence, Belonging, Collaboration, Reflection, Good Manners and Respect (which I suggest are equally applicable to all of us, not just the children), everyone at the school has worked exceptionally hard this year and we have seen many great results.

And whilst it's easy for me to bash on about how great the school is, I thought I'd take this opportunity to highlight a few sound-bytes from other people...

We look forward to seeing those existing pupils and new Foundation Stage pupils who will be with us in September; but equally we wish our Year 2 pupils all the best as they take the knowledge and skills that they have learnt at John Hampden and continue their learning journey - wherever that may take them...

3. IMPORTANT MESSAGES

Warm Weather

We are enjoying a particularly hot period of weather at the moment. Please make sure your child comes to school with sun cream applied and with a sunhat to wear. Children in KS1 should be provided with a named water bottle which must not contain juice or squash please. Children in EYFS have access to water at all times so do not need to bring in their own water bottle. Please see the advice on the NHS website—Public Health England—Beat the heat.

MEDICATION IN SCHOOL

Can I please remind all parents that any medication kept in school must be collected at the end of term. We will endeavour to hand it over on the last day. Any medication left at the end of term will be taken to the pharmacy for disposal as we can't keep medication on site over the long Summer break.

LOST PROPERTY

We put out tables of unnamed lost property at the recent Open Evening. Please check the lost property boxes by the end of term if you are still missing something as all items left will be sent to a charity if they are not claimed.

SCROLL OF HONOUR

If your child has been included on the Scroll of Honour this year please would you check that you have returned the special yellow badge. These are loaned for one week and should have been returned—they are very precious to us!

SCOOTING IN AND AROUND SCHOOL GROUNDS

Please could we remind you that children should not ride bikes or scooters within the school grounds. There is a risk of children/younger siblings being knocked down if children attempt to ride on the paths around the school or in the scooter/bike parking area.

Also, could we remind you that children should not be allowed to ride their bikes and scooters in the area outside Wendover Junior School while waiting for older siblings.

STAFF CAR PARK

The car park at the school is designated for staff only. We are noticing a number of parents trying to park here while they take their children swimming etc. Please remember that the campus roads should only be used by staff and delivery vehicles. Thank you for your co-operation.

CONSIDERATE PARKING

If you do need to drive your child to school ensure that you park thoughtfully and considerately—local residents must have access to their driveways at all times. Thank you for your co-operation.

4. CURRICULUM

This year a range of events have been planned as part of our Enterprise Week initiative. A few more classes have organised their events in the last fortnight. This is what they did:

7. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

We aim to ensure you are aware of our key achievements this year:

GOAL A: LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

- To date we have not received our expected Ofsted visit much work has taken place to ensure that when we are visited we are ready to impress!
- The building project is well underway and is due to be completed in October 2018. We are not now expanding to four forms of entry in September 2018.
- The budget situation remains a concern but internal fundraising activities have been successful and a new fundraising initiative is ready to be launched in September.
- Collaboration with our liaison group of schools has gone from strength to strength and we have also benefited from establishing close working relationships with other educational professionals over the year.
- The 30 hour funded places in our Nursery Class have been a tremendous success and the Crickets Class have really thrived this year.



GOAL C: PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT, BEHAVIOUR & WELFARE

- Mrs Spencer has led a highly successful reading mentors project with pupils in Year 2, Year 3 and Foundation Stage.
- Badgers class took part in a successful linking schools project with Waterside School, Chesham.
- Staff well-being scores improved since last year for all groups.
- Fewer children lost Golden Time for breaking the Golden Rules, 'Do be gentle' and 'Do be kind and helpful'.
- Transition arrangements into and out of the school continue to be improved and developed.
- Courses for parents and opportunities for parents to learn how to support pupil learning have impacted positively.

GOAL B: QUALITY OF TEACHING, LEARNING & ASSESSMENT



- The quality of writing has improved as a result of teacher's modelling writing in front of the children more often.
- Liaison Group moderation sessions have helped to ensure consistency

of assessments.

- Staff at John Hampden are now trained moderators for EYFS and KS1 assessments.
- The policies for Behaviour, Marking & Feedback and Presentation are now more consistently applied across the school.
- Adults are deployed in a more cost effective manner across the school.
- Growth Mindsets training has been completed by all stakeholders.

GOAL D: PUPIL OUTCOMES



- We have maintained, and in some cases improved, the high academic standards that have become synonymous with John Hampden.
- Targeted support initiatives for groups and individuals have been successful in improving progress and attainment results.
- More children achieved the expected standard in reading, writing, maths and science at the end of KS1.
- By completing pen profiles teachers have an even clearer understanding of the context, progress and achievement of individual pupils.
