Mrs Spencer is also available to support parents with non-urgent issues and I will always make myself available if you feel you need to speak to me.

2. GOVERNOR SECTION

One of the nicest things about being a School Governor is the opportunity that you get to visit John Hampden when special events are happening.

Recently the School has had both Safety and Health Weeks and my visit was on the Friday afternoon of Health Week. Jo Spencer told me about the wide range of health linked activities which had taken place so far, some of which have already featured in the School Newsletter, and then we went into the hall to join the Squirrels and Eagles

The hall itself had been transformed with games and puzzles everywhere, on the walls, tables and on the floor. After a brief introduction, the children were soon engrossed in the very varied range of activities on offer. Initially all eyes were drawn to a prominently displayed set of giant false teeth but as they walked around each group of four settled down to a different activity and having read the instructions they were soon engaging enthusiastically in the numerous games.

The children showed they were very familiar with the Government's Traffic Light system and foods and household goods were soon allocated to the appropriate bin with great speed and accuracy.

Test tubes with varying amounts of salt or sugar brought out the scientist in the children in two of the games. Despite some deep discussions, they, like many adults, were sometimes surprised by the quantity of salt or sugar contained in innocent looking every day foods.

The health benefits, or otherwise, of numerous drinks featured in one of the table mounted games and again the children demonstrated a very thoughtful approach and attitude to a subject which can easily fox grownups.

As a mere adult I thought that probably the most difficult of all the tasks was to construct a body using double sided cards containing pictures of parts of the skeleton on one side and major muscles on the other. If a card was inadvertently placed the wrong way up (not difficult) it threw the whole construction out. The amount of perseverance and application the children showed on this particularly taxing task was remarkable.

Despite coming at the end of a very busy week the children were clearly enthused by this entertaining and stimulating session and I was delighted to have been part of it.

Coats

Just a reminder that, as the weather is changing significantly now, children do need to come to school wearing a suitable outdoor coat for this time of the year. Children are outside for several

periods during the school day and they need to be suitably dressed. We have a few children who are still wearing shorts and we thought you should be aware that they will be outside on most days—only torrential rain stops us! Gloves and hats are encouraged (named, of course!)

Data collection sheets

In order to ensure that all our information is up to date and accurate, children in Year 1 will be coming home with a data collection sheet for you to check, amend if necessary, sign and return. Thank you.

Adverse Weather Conditions

If we need to close the school this winter due to adverse weather conditions the following procedures will be used to inform parents.

- 1. A decision will be made about the school closure by 7.30am. This decision will be based on health and safety grounds, which may include not having enough staff at school to supervise our pupils.
- 2. By 7.45a.m the school website home page will be updated with closure details. MIX 96 will have been contacted and should announce our school closure at regular intervals throughout the morning. The County Council's website will also list our school closure: www.buckscc.gov.uk
- 3. If the notices listed above have not been implemented then you are to assume the school will remain open.
- 4. With these three methods of communication in place, there should be no need for you to telephone the school asking whether we will be open or closed.
- 5. Should the school open but need to close earlier than 3.15p.m, we will contact you via text or telephone.

Please be assured that school closure will always be a last resort.

It is entirely the responsibility of the parent/carer to decide whether it is safe to travel to and from school in inclement weather and we respect the choices you make. As usual please inform the school by telephone or in writing if your child will be absent from school.

7. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

We aim to keep you fully informed of our actions linked to the school improvement plan. In the last two weeks we have made progress linked to the actions outlined below:

GOAL A: LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

The senior leadership team (Mrs Barnes, Mrs Parkinson, Miss Nawaz and Mrs Spencer) are working to ensure the school's self evaluation is accurate. We have recently received new data about the school, based on 2016 statutory assessment results for our pupils, and this is being used to update the Self Evaluation document and to inform plans about further school improvement. The website is constantly being updated and monitored to ensure statutory requirements are met.

GOAL B: TEACHING, LEARNING & ASSESSMENT

The quality of the learning environment was monitored following the first half term and class teachers are given feedback regarding strengths and areas for further development.

The assessment week at the end of the first half of the Autumn term allows staff to complete activities to confirm their judgements about a pupil's strengths and areas for development. The staff work together to moderate their judgements and recently they have spent time comparing findings within each year group to ensure there is a common understanding and a consistent approach to planning and setting targets for improvement. These targets are regularly reviewed and any necessary interventions are put in place to try to ensure each child reaches his/her goals—these may have been discussed with you at the recent Parents' Evenings. To ensure consistency across the local area our staff have also attended Liaison Group moderation sessions where writing from each year group in the schools is shared.

GOAL C: BEHAVIOUR, PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT & WELFARE

At the beginning of the school year we further enhanced our transition arrangements to ease the move from one year group to the next. The transition timetable ran for the first half term and ensured that:

- Children had time to get used to their new teaching areas and their new teaching staff
- Children had time to get used to new routines and became familiar with the high expectations in each year group
- Foundation Stage children had time to learn to use and tidy up equipment appropriately
- Year 1 children continued to have times where EYFS type child-initiated learning could take place
- Year 2 children became familiar with the added roles and responsibilities that come with being the oldest year group in the school.

We are in the process of evaluating how successful these transition arrangements have been. Following Health and Safety weeks a revised timetable has been introduced which aims to develop and progress the curriculum and the organisation of teaching in all year groups. Hopefully this will run smoothly as a consequence of the children being given time to settle happily into their new classes.

GOAL D: PUPIL OUTCOMES

At the end of October we receive a report which compares the performance of our school to that of other schools nationally. We have spent time analysing this data and comparing it to previous years and other annual attainment and progress measures. We are pleased to be able to report that the results data from statutory assessments for 2015-2016 reflects the fact that significantly more of our pupils achieved at least the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths when compared to local and national data. Our Phonics data showed a further improvement and a significant number of our pupils achieved a good level of development during their time in Foundation Stage. Our challenge will be to maintain these high standards with the increased expectations of the new National Curriculum.
