1. Message from Mrs Barnes

Mrs Parkinson or I have attended each meeting to welcome parents and to provide some extra information. In addition to this, please note:

Emergency Contact Details—please do remember to inform the school if any of your emergency contact details have changed recently. It is vital that we hold the most up to date information for you.

Arrangements for Voluntary Contributions— Each parent will soon receive a letter which includes an itemized list of the cost of activities which the teachers are planning for the term. Parents can then sign in to their Parentpay account to make the payment. This is a voluntary contribution and there is no obligation involved but unfortunately we may have to cancel activities if not enough parents opt to pay. We try to arrange as many activities as possible in school to avoid the additional cost of coaches but from time to time we will take the children slightly further a field so termly payment requests may reflect this.

Save the date:

We are delighted that so many parents are keen to encourage their child's learning at home and we would like to offer some support in helping you to do this. On the school calendar you may have seen that we were planning to hold a Curriculum Evening for parents on Thursday 26th September. This has now been postponed until **Thursday 17th October**. The meeting is intended to give help and guidance to parents in terms of how best to support success at school. You will receive a letter about this in your child's book bag nearer the time.

2. GOVERNOR SECTION

Dear Parents and Carers,

It is always a pleasure to welcome pupils, both new and old, and their families to John Hampden. I trust everyone had a great summer and are now ready and raring to get going on your learning adventure.

Starting a new school is a big step and change can be tricky for pupils of any age, especially younger children. The school dedicates a significant amount of time to the transition process (i.e. moving to a new school, or moving up to a new school year), both at the end of the Summer Term and also moving forwards in September. As a result of this, hopefully, by now, everyone is starting to settle into their new classes, getting used to their new routines and making lots of new friends. However, if your child is experiencing on-going worries, please do let your class teacher know. Ensuring and promoting happiness and positivity is one of our key priorities at John Hampden, Wendover.

One of our aims, as Governors, at the start of a new academic year is to improve our contact with parents, carers and friends of the school and raise awareness of the work we do. The governing board can often appear remote from everyday school life and for many parents the role we play is often not obvious. As way of introduction, we are a group of volunteers who help to set the strategic direction, aims and objectives of the school, and evaluate educational performance and the progress of its pupils. We act as a 'critical friend' to challenge and support our Head Teacher, Mrs Barnes, and the other members of the Senior Leadership Team. We also oversee the financial performance of the school, ensuring its money is well spent, and provide support in the performance management of staff.

It's not all budget analysis and progress reports though (thankfully!). We are all assigned a specific subject (or two) and a liaison teacher, from which we base our school visits. We are also encouraged to visit the school for some of the fun stuff, such as Harvest Festival, the Nativity Plays and Christmas Fayre. I hope that by the end of the Autumn Term you feel you have a better understanding of who we are and what we do. Finally, I'd also like to highlight the amazing work that the PTA does for the school. Each and every year the Friends of John Hampden run a huge number of marvellous events aimed at pupils, parents and carers. 3. IMPORTANT MESSAGES

School Times & Behaviour

- This is a reminder that pupils should not arrive in school before 8.45a.m each morning when the classroom doors will be opened. Pupils may arrive at anytime between 8.45 and 8.55a.m and we hope this slightly staggered start will ease congestion at one of the busiest times of the day. We would also remind parents/carers that they should be at school at 3.15pm to collect their child. We obviously understand if there are unforeseen circumstances that mean you may be late on rare occasions and we will always supervise children if they have to wait. However, we would ask you to make alternative childcare arrangements if late collection is a regular occurrence.
- Also please could we ask you to reinforce our clear message to the children that they should not attempt to
 play/climb on any of the equipment/ramps or railings outside their classrooms as they arrive or leave school. These
 areas are not supervised by school staff at these times and we obviously don't want children to be hurt or equipment to be damaged.

Milk

School Bank

School Bank runs every Wednesday outside Mrs Barnes' office.

Children can pay in as much or as little as they like, a great way to start learning the importance of saving and watching their pocket money grow.

You can open a Young Savers account in the Wendover branch (in Back Street). You will need a birth certificate or passport along with proof of address and the parent signing the application forms will need their driving licence as this will also cover the signature ID.

Alternatively, you can visit our lucky dip stall (all proceeds go to the school) at the Christmas Fayre on 30th November and sign up there, as long as the signing parent has a driving licence on them, the school will then verify the child's details. All new Young Savers will receive a Harpenden piggy bank. For more details, contact the branch on 01296 623595.

Water Bottles

We do encourage children in Year One and Year Two to bring a water bottle to school each day. This is in addition to their lunchtime drink. Your child will have easy access to their water bottle throughout the day. Children are reminded to take their water bottles home each night to be refilled. Please do not put squash or juice in these bottles as it is less healthy and can also be very sticky! Foundation Stage children have access to water all day so should not bring a water bottle to school. Thank you

THANKS

On behalf of Mrs Spencer and everyone at the school we would like to extend our thanks to everyone who helped to maintain and water the school garden over the summer holiday. Your effort is greatly appreciated by all of us.

Nuts

We do have several children in the school with a severe allergy to nuts. We would be grateful if you would refrain from providing nuts in lunchboxes to reduce the risk of allergic reactions. We also ask that there are no sweets or fizzy drinks in lunchboxes. We would also ask that children DO NOT bring in sweets/treats for their classmates when it is their birthday. Thank you

Naming Belongings

After the first few P.E lessons/ clubs, it is clear that many children have clothing that is not named and this is causing real difficulties for staff. Please would you ensure all belongings are named and that children are aware of where the name is on their things. It is obvious that some children would really benefit from having some extra practise when dressing/undressing independently and keeping their clothing in neat piles, socks in shoes etc. We would really appreciate your support with this.

Book Bags

Please could children refrain from hanging numerous keyrings/toys from the handles of their book bags. One 'flat' keyring is acceptable for identification purposes.

SCHOOL TRAVEL NEWS

We are nearly ready to re-introduce our walk to school initiative called 'WOW'. The charity 'Living Streets' has encouraged many schools across the UK to sign up to this initiative. We have been taking part for a couple of years now and it has been well received by the children and their parents and carers within the school.

Pupils log their daily journeys to school each day on the WOW interactive Travel Tracker in their class and those that walk, scoot or bike to or from school at least three times a week for a month earn a WOW badge.

(From September 2019, your child will have the chance to earn all 11 badges on offer).

I know there are concerns about plastic in the environment, but our badges are made from recycled yogurt pots and can be recycled again. We are looking into having a recycling point at the school so please read future school newsletters to see when this is up and running if you wish to recycle the badges. Our interactive travel tracker also means we are not using hundreds of paper resources either!

Walking to school helps children feel happier and healthier and even do better in class because they arrive fit, refreshed and ready to learn. More families walking means fewer cars on the road during the school run, helping to reduce congestion and pollution around the campus road and surrounding streets.

If you live too far away or don't have time to walk the whole way to school, you can Park and Stride and it still counts as an active journey. Park at least ten minutes away from the school and walk the rest of the way, or park at a friend's house and walk the rest of the way.


The WOW travel tracker will be up and running from Monday 23rd September.

4. Pupil's Section

The pupils have now been at school for two and a half weeks and I can report that for the Autumn Term we currently have 292 pupils on roll.

Being an infant school, our pupils are fortunate to have the opportunity to take on roles of responsibility earlier than in some combined schools. This year we have chosen to focus on providing as many opportunities as possible for our oldest pupils to nurture and support the younger children in the school. This started on the very first day of term when we selected a number of Year Two pupils to support the Foundation Stage pupils as they stayed for lunch at school for the first time. They were encouraged to offer their assistance in the dining hall, supporting the Foundation Stage classes in different ways. These included; accompanying them back to their cloakroom to fetch coats, putting lunchboxes away, reminding them of where to find the toilets and directing them to the playground. They also offered a helping hand to those in search of a friend. They did a marvellous job and we are very proud of the school values they demonstrated while performing this role.

The lunchtime supervisors were also pleased with their efforts and commented;

"They have gone above and beyond in their role."

All staff have been impressed with their willingness to help others, they have demonstrated a mature and caring attitude towards their peers. This clearly reflects our ethos as a school; valuing the culture of kindness and mutual respect.

5. CURRICULUM

This year, as a result of feedback from the children and staff, we are continuing with our weekly Merit Assembly followed by Golden Time. The 'Scroll of Honour' will, once again, provide opportunities for children to be spotted for doing something special. We have seven Golden Rules that underpin our Behaviour Policy. Children who consistently follow the Golden Rules will be rewarded each Friday afternoon with approximately 45 minutes of 'Golden Time'. This term each teacher has planned a different exciting activity, and during the term each class will rotate through the different activities. Activities include: visiting the Octagon, art and craft activities, multi-media, construction and music. Children who have lost some minutes of their Golden Time will spend this time with Mrs Barnes. We hope that these appealing activities will be a real incentive to encourage everyone to follow the Golden Rules.

Within each class we also include a 'Thinking Mat' which, if necessary, children are asked to sit on to reflect on their behaviour.

All pupils are following a carefully designed 'transition timetable' for the first half of the Autumn Term. We hope that a timetable which allows time for staff to ensure children are settled and getting used to the regular routines and expectations, will be beneficial for all.

Philosophy sessions/activities continue to be a regular feature. This may sound rather ambitious but children are naturally curious and educational research suggests that encouraging children to ask questions and to listen to other people's ideas helps them to understand their thoughts and how they affect their lives.

It is fascinating to hear the children's thoughts and we find that from one starting point many more questions are posed. The only thing to remember with philosophy is that there are no right or wrong answers—just the opportunity to hear, develop and value different viewpoints.

HARVEST FESTIVAL

7. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

As the new academic year begins we are embarking on actions linked to our new School Development Plan 2019-2020 which aims to guide improvements to the school over this time. In deciding the areas to focus on we took into consideration many factors e.g. stakeholder views expressed in questionnaires and comments, feedback from other outside agencies, data analysis, Government policy etc.

In the next newsletters I will share a summary of the findings from the annual parent survey as well as the new priorities for the school plan so you can see what we are aiming to achieve.

However, during the summer holiday and over the next weeks/month, works to develop and improve the school environment are on-going:

During the holiday:

- The Foundation Stage outside learning area was tidied and new storage units were installed
- A new fence was put up to complete the playground improvements
- The school office was re-organised to provide additional working space for staff
- The Group Room was re-organised to allow for additional space for OOSC
- Scaffolding was put in place to allow contractors to re-cover the flat roofs above the Year 2 classrooms
- Deep cleaning took place
- The school garden was fully established and maintained by a team of committed waterers!
- Two skips were filled!

In the coming weeks:

- The outside learning space for the Year One classes will be completed with the installation of new equipment funded by the FJH.
- Scaffolding will be erected to allow for the flat roofs above the office buildings to be replaced
- We will reach the end of the defects period for the large building project so all outstanding issues will be addressed
- Repair work to the Adventure Trail will be completed
