1. Message from Mrs Barnes

In an infant school, at the beginning of a new school year, I think it is particularly important for the children to be given time to settle into their new classes, getting to know their new teachers and teaching assistants. We have spent time in the first few weeks focusing on our 'Behaviour Expectations' (new name for the old Golden Rules) and reinforcing our core values so that all pupils are fully aware of the things that are important to our school community. I regularly visit the classes during the working day and it is very encouraging to watch the children adjusting to the routines and expectations of school life. We aim to have a positive approach to behaviour management, and our behaviour expectations highlight what children should do, rather than what they should not! We have made some important changes to our Behaviour Policy this year (available on the school website) which include removing the sun, thinking cloud and rain cloud from the classrooms and replacing these with a 'Recognition Board' where children's names are written immediately we spot them doing something particularly well. We believe it is important to acknowledge when children do well and at John Hampden, this is done in a variety of ways. Feedback from teaching staff is the most immediate method, but stickers and pebbles are also used as reward tokens in many of the classes. Children are sent to me or Mrs Parkinson to share their learning when they have done exceptionally well and we reward this behaviour with special stickers and a gold star to take home. Each Friday we are holding our new 'Over & Above' assembly, in which children from each class are chosen to receive a special certificate and sticker. This is awarded by the class teachers and teaching assistants for exceptional behaviour or exceptional learning. Children receiving the 'Over & Above' certificates are invited to sit on special chairs and a star is put onto our display board in the hall to remind us of their

A silver cup is awarded to the 'Class of the Week'. So far Squirrels and Caterpillars have won the cup - I'll leave your children to tell you who won it today!

Finally, 'The Scroll of Honour' is unfurled. The scroll contains the names of any child in the school who has been spotted by any adult for doing something special. The children are called to the front of the hall and the whole school sing a congratulatory song to them. Each child whose name is on the scroll will bring home a special certificate so you know what they have done to impress us. They will also be given a yellow badge to wear on their jumper during the following week.

We also like to celebrate achievement outside school and we have a display board in the corridor to showcase the talents of our pupils. If your child is awarded a certificate or an award for swimming, dancing, sport, music etc. we are happy to take a photocopy or photograph and put it up on the board.

We are looking forward to our upcoming Parents' Evenings where we can provide you with feedback about how your child is settling into their new class. From our perspective it appears the online system for making appointments has worked successfully. Please remember that only one parent should attend the appointment and a face covering is advised. The 10 minute appointments will take place in a well ventilated space and you will need to follow the signposted route to reach your child's class teacher. If, following your appointment, you would like to speak to me or Mrs Parkinson about any matter please come to the main entrance where we can arrange a mutually convenient time and place to speak.

Hello All,

Firstly, I would like to pass my sincere thanks to Jay Edley for his commitment to the school over the past years as Chair of Governors. Jay has been a valuable asset to the school and the Governing Board and has certainly helped me transition into replacing him as Chair of Governors. Outside of being the Chair of Governors I have 2 children at the school after my eldest moved onto the Wendover Junior School this year. I work as a Head of Programmes within the NHS and enjoy lots of physical activities swimming, running, tennis, and football along with the occasional bottle (I mean glass!) of red wine.

We are certainly in full swing now and off to a great start to the new academic year. Thanks to the efforts of the senior leadership team and teaching staff at the school I feel the transition into new surroundings for all of the children has been a smooth one. I witnessed a small number of upset children as they got to the classroom doors early in the term and with that have noticed how well you parents and teachers have managed the situation over the last weeks meaning the number has now reduced to almost none. A great effort by staff, parents, carers and the little ones themselves! Book bags have started coming home with reading materials, phonics sheets and wonderful creative pieces of work that children have worked so hard on and are so excited about.

The transition has been an excellent one and I have seen many happy faces on their way into school. However, there are some faces I don't see as they are hidden away in vehicles. I just wanted to write a polite reminder that the campus is not designed for pick-up and drop off by vehicles and parents should not be attempting to drive onto the campus unless they have applied to the school for permission to do so. I appreciate that walking to school is not an option for many families due to distance, however if driving please remember to park off campus and walk the remainder of the way. The children do also get reminded in their classrooms and in assemblies that safely walking into school is expected of them. Please remind your children that when cycling or scooting into school they have to be especially careful as other young children are also making their way in on the footpath.

COATS

Children are involved in learning outside the classroom everyday so it is really important that they bring a named coat to school everyday especially as it is starting to get a little colder and wetter now. Also, could you check that your child has their own name in their belongings. Sometimes children wear pre-owned uniform that has a previous pupils name in it—and obviously that can cause confusion!

REMINDER

Please remember that children should not bring in sweets/treats for classmates when it is their birthday. We have a number of children with allergies and it is safer to say no to this altogether in order to avoid upset and disappointment.

IMPORTANT MESSAGE

Please do not use mobile phones whilst on the school grounds. In this way, we are safeguarding our pupils by ensuring there is no chance of anyone taking unauthorised photographs/videos within the school environment. Please remind others of this message if you spot anyone on their phone—it is a shared responsibility.

This is also applicable when bringing or collecting from our Out of School Care provision.


Growth Mindset

In addition to being Hedgehogs class teacher I have responsibility for overseeing Growth Mindset across the school.

At John Hampden School we encourage all our children, and adults, to have a Growth Mindset. Key Stage One have a Growth Mindset assembly every Thursday and each classroom has a 'Great Learning Adventure' board. This helps remind the children that when learning something new, we will find it a challenge but if we persevere we can achieve what we set out to do. We encourage the children to say 'I can't do it YET' rather than 'I can't do it.' This reminds us that the possibility to achieve is always there.

What is Growth Mindset?

Carol Dweck is an American psychologist who has spent many years researching how we learn and how our mindset affects our ability to succeed. She is of the belief that it's not just our abilities and talent that bring us success—but whether we approach them with a fixed or growth mindset. The table below outlines the behaviours that determine whether we have a growth or a fixed mindset. We very much encourage the children at John Hampden School to see challenge as positive and making mistakes as being part of learning. We always encourage children to 'have a go' as this is the first step to success and can often be the most daunting stage of learning something new.



How can you support Growth Mindset at home?

One of the best ways you can model a growth mindset is to speak about mistakes you've made, and what you've learned from them. Speak positively about your mistakes and struggles, and this will show your children that taking risks and making mistakes are a natural part of the learning process. Explain to your children that trying hard things is what helps us grow, and you can't be perfect when you try something hard!

The way we praise our children can have a profound impact on their mindset. Research on praise and mindsets shows that when we praise children for being 'good' or 'clever', it promotes a fixed mindset. It sends a message that their accomplishments are trait-based, and tied to something innate. In contrast, praising children for the effort involved promotes a growth mindset. It sends a message that the child's effort is what led them to success.

You can encourage this at home, rather than praise the outcome, make the praise specific, for example.....

Instead of saying	Try saying
I love your picture	Wow, I can see you've worked hard to keep the colouring inside the lines
Great reading	Well done for using your phonics to help you sound out that difficult word
Good girl/Good boy (This is a very vague statement for children as they often don't know why they are 'good')	I'm really pleased with the effort you put into I'm really happy that you did it shows me how hard you've tried
That's not right	You've worked hard to spell that word, keep trying as you are nearly there!
I'll do it for you	Let's try together because if we keep trying we'll get better
Great work, you're really clever	Great work, you put a lot of effort into doing that so well
Well done for getting all your spellings right	Well done for working hard to learn all those spellings. I can see how much effort you made and it paid off


5. Pupil's Section




Badgers Class performed Cauliflowers Fluffy

7. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT
