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1. MESSAGE FROM MRS BARNES

I wanted to start this newsletter by thanking those of you who were able to attend the recent FJH May Fayre. Your support was tremendous and we managed to raise a huge sum which will be put to very good use. My thanks to the FJH Committee for organizing this very successful event and to the governors, staff and volunteers who supported the various stalls—it was a wonderful afternoon and despite a forecast of potential rain it actually stayed warm and dry throughout.

At least once a term we try to provide enrichment weeks where the normal timetable is replaced by a week or two of something a little bit different. In the Autumn Term we spent two weeks focussing on Health and Safety. In the Spring Term we had Arts Week and Discovery Week. When the children return after half term, we have planned 'World Weeks'. These weeks have always been very enjoyable and popular with the pupils in the past and we will put out all the work for parents/carers to come and share at the Open Evening in July.

Weather permitting, on Friday 21st June, FS and KS1 Sports Day is planned. This is our own sporting competition in which we hope the competitors will demonstrate the core sporting values of:

respect - fair play; knowing one's own limits; and taking care of one's health and the environment excellence - how to give the best of oneself, on the field of play or in life; taking part; and progressing according to one's own objectives

The next phase of work will see the installation of a stage, storage shed, a story-telling chair and large free-standing whiteboards, all contributing to the transformation of the important outside learning spaces.

ANNUAL QUESTIONNAIRE

WATER BOTTLES

Reminder that we do encourage children to bring a bottle of <u>water</u> to school each day to keep on their desks—this is in addition to the drink you may provide in a lunch box. In warmer weather many children are glad of the chance to keep a drink close by.

Please check that your child's school uniform is correctly named. There are a huge number of jumpers and cardigans in lost property that are not named so cannot be returned to their owners.

CHARGING SURVEY

4. PUPIL'S SECTION

Year 1 examples of good information writing:-

Tigers—Tigers have black and orange stripes and the sharpest teeth in the world. Tigers jump up on their front paws when they are angry. Did you know tigers eat meat? Tigers duck in grass when they are trying to hunt other animals. Tigers can eat any animal in the world (Jack B—Squirrels)

Lions—The lions closest relatives are the tiger, the jaguar and the leopard. Prides can have as few as five lions in them or as many as forty. Lions are amazing. Why don't you go and see one for yourself? (Milo—Hedgehogs)

Hippos—What they look like—Hippos have big round eyes and quite small ears. They also have huge round tummies and big heads. Hippos have huge sharp teeth that stick out of their gums. What they eat—Hippos have a diet of mostly meat and a little veg which means they are omnivores. They have to hunt to find food. (Steven—Hedgehogs)

Elephants—Elephants tusks never stop growing. Did you know there are two types of elephants? Elephants trunk size can grow about two metres long. Elephants are interesting and now you know more about them. (Hen—Badgers)

Great White Shark—A great white shark has two rows of sharp teeth at the bottom part of the mouth. They have a creamy white streak on their big grey tummies. They are very big and have yellowish white teeth in their gigantic mouths. They have big pointy noses. A great white shark has fins on both sides of its big grey body. (Zoe—Badgers)

Lions—Male lions are so big it is difficult for them to hunt. Lions have sharp teeth. Lions live up to 15 years in the wild. (Ryder—Badgers)

8. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

We aim to keep you fully informed of our actions linked to the school improvement plan. Since the last newsletter we have:-

GOAL A: LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

Mrs Parkinson and Mrs McNally have begun their annual moderator roles. This involves them visiting other schools in the County and moderating the assessments that have been completed in order to ensure consistency in judgements across Buckinghamshire. This role takes them out of our school for several days but it does ensure that we, at John Hampden, benefit from having trained and qualified moderators on the staff.



Each term a committee of the Governing Board meet to find out more about what goes on in school. The Teaching, Learning and Curriculum Committee try to ensure that members of staff with specific areas of expertise are invited along to share the work they are doing in school. Mrs Grimsdell recently gave a great presentation on the value of yoga within the curriculum.

GOAL B: QUALITY OF TEACHING & LEARNING

Outside learning is a valuable tool we can use to engage and motivate children. We have worked hard to provide a stimulating and well resourced outside learning space for our EYFS pupils and now we are embarking on developing a similar quality of provision for our KS1 pupils. A new gazebo—funded by FJH events—has been erected and is almost ready for the Year 1 classes to use. The teachers have been busy ourcing resources to make this new area an irresistible space to extend and develop learning.

GOAL C: PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT, BEHAVIOUR & WELFARE

Staff well-being is important to us, so each year we conduct a well-being survey with every member of our team so we can compare findings from previous years and identify areas for improvement. The survey is completed at this time each year.



GOAL D: PUPIL OUTCOMES

The month of May sees our Year 2 pupils taking part in the statutory assessment procedures for the end of Key Stage 1. The tests were administered with great care and sensitivity by our Year 2 teachers and we now need to wait for national standardised scores to be published in order to see whether our pupils have been judged to be working at age related expectations within the National Curriculum. Staff from the school will also attend moderation sessions with Year 3 teachers from Wendover Junior School.




Aylesbury Garden Town's Bicycle Bus!


