1. Message from Mrs Barnes

Welcome back to the Summer Term. I hope you had an enjoyable Easter holiday and managed to enjoy some of the beautiful sunshine we were lucky enough to experience.

Starting School in September 2021

During the holiday we received a firm indication of numbers for our Foundation Stage classes in September 2021. It would appear we will be almost full with 89 of the 90 places being offered so far. Once again we will remain at three forms of entry and we will delay any move to four form entry until we have a clear indication that numbers will make this financially viable. Places have also been offered for our Early Years class from September 2021. This class has 26 available places and so far we have filled 21. If you are still looking for an Early Years provider please contact the school office for more information. The class is open for any child born between 1st September 2017 and 31st August 2018 and we aim to take just one intake per year, so if we fill all 26 places by September we will not be able to accept any more eligible children for the rest of the academic year unless anyone leaves. To enable parents and children to learn more about the Early Years class we are holding an Open Morning on Saturday 15th May between 9.30am and 11.30am. This event will be carefully managed with Covid-19 restrictions in place so anyone who wishes to attend needs to contact the school office via office@jhampden.bucks.sch.uk or 01296 622629 to book a time. Meetings with Parents

I am sure you are keen to hear how your child has settled back into school following the lockdown period and the Easter holiday, so we are planning to provide an opportunity for you to make an appointment to talk to your child's class teacher. If the Government's road map continues on the current trajectory we are all expecting things to change slightly from Monday 17th May, so it will be during this week that we will be offering the chance for you to attend a socially distanced meeting with the class teacher in a similar way to our offer back in October 2020. The meetings will take place outside the classroom and on Wednesday next week you will be receiving an email explaining how to log on to the Eschools platform to make an appointment. If you have mislaid your Eschools account login and password, please contact the school office and we can provide a reminder. I do appreciate that some people may still prefer a virtual appointment so we would ask you to contact the school office if you would prefer to communicate via Zoom and we will organise a 10 minute appointment.

I am sure you are also keen to know whether we will be holding other events that traditionally happen during the Summer Term e.g. Sports Day. The honest answer is that we are waiting for further guidance from the Department for Education and the Local Authority before we can commit to anything. However, behind the scenes we are making sure the children get some of the experiences we know they enjoy so all classes are currently practising country dances, or having the chance to dance around the Maypole, as they traditionally would have done if we were able to hold our usual May Day celebration. I'm sorry we are not able to invite you to watch these things but the children certainly aren't missing out on the opportunity.

POLITE REQUEST

Please could we ask that parents/carers collecting children from the Early Years and Foundation Stage classes do not let any of their children play on the outside learning equipment at the start and end of the school day. As we do not have staff supervising the areas at these times we would ask that you refrain from using them for safety reasons. Having highlighted the issue in the newsletter and reinforced the message with the children in the Early Years and Foundation Stage classes we would really appreciate your support with this. Our staff work hard to encourage our pupils to respect a specific set of rules regarding the use of the outside equipment during the school day and this is sometimes undermined if parents allow something different when they are in charge!

REMINDER

This is a further reminder that all school uniform must be named. As we reach the Summer Term more children are taking off their coats, cardigans and jumpers and if they are not named there is the real possibility that they may find their way into the lost property box where it is very difficult to match it with the real owner.

WATER BOTTLES & SUN CREAM

We have enjoyed some lovely sunny weather recently and at these times it is particularly important that children remain hydrated. Please rest assured that all children have access to water at all times so there is no need for them to bring a water bottle to school.


We advise parents to apply sun cream to their children before they come to school. If you believe your child needs sun cream applied more often, please let the class teacher know and they can organise times for this to happen. Children should be taught to apply their own cream -thank you.

SIGNING HOME/SCHOOL DIARIES

Please can we remind parents that we encourage you to hear your child read for a short amount of time each day. 'Little and often' is the best way and we would ask that you sign your child's diary when you have heard them and indicate which pages you have listened to. Please remember that every child also has access to a whole book shelf of online books from the Collins e-book library. 4. RELATIONSHIPS EDUCATION – CONSULTATION

Relationships Education Parental Consultation

We are seeking parental engagement in response to The Department for Education required changes to Relationships Education whereby the teaching of Relationships and Health Education will be statutory from the beginning of KS1 from the Summer term 2021 (original compliance date of September 2020 was delayed due to Covid-19).

The consultation process will involve one or two meetings of approximately one hour in length via Zoom to review John Hampden's Relationships Policy and current Curriculum practice with the opportunity to read through relevant documents before the meetings take place.
