## 1. Message from Mrs Barnes

It is hard to believe that the Spring Term has almost ended—Christmas seems a long time ago and there are very clear signs that Spring is definitely here. The term has been quite a busy one and we have enjoyed numerous memorable learning opportunities.

Last Saturday we held an Open Morning in our Nursery Class and invited prospective new children and their parents to come and look around. It was lovely that so many people were able to join us and we are hopeful of filling all twenty six places in the class for September 2019. We will be issuing places in April so if you do know of anyone who is looking for high quality, Early Years education in a well resourced, nurturing environment do remind them that they need to contact us as soon as possible. Eligible children will be born between 1st September 2015 and 31st August 2016.

The improving weather at the moment reminds us that summer is just around the corner and we will be continuing with our tradition of welcoming the season by celebrating May Day. On <u>Wednesday 1st May at 9.30am</u> we are holding our annual May Day celebration for children in Foundation Stage, Year 1 and Year 2. As space in the hall is limited we only invite parents of children in Year 2 to watch because Year 1 parents were invited to the Harvest Assembly in the Autumn Term - we try to make it fair! Early Years and Foundation Stage parents—your time will come.

As usual we would ask that Year 2 parents try to make alternative arrangements for younger siblings as they often find it difficult to sit quietly through a performance lasting just over one hour. If you do have to bring a younger child please would you ensure they sit on your lap and if they do start to make a distracting noise take them out of the hall until they become quieter.

On the day, as we are celebrating the fact that summer is approaching, we are inviting all the **girls** in Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 to come to school wearing **something summery** which is appropriate to dance in. They will not need to bring their school uniform as they will wear their summer outfit all day. **Boys** in Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 should come to school looking smart in **shorts or trousers and a shirt/top**.

Our Year 1 children are responsible for choosing the May Queen and her attendants and we will also have a child dressed as the Lucky Sweep. We will put lots of the photos we take on the school website so you can share the event even if you are not able to attend in person.

May I take this opportunity to wish you a very peaceful and relaxing Easter break and I look forward to seeing you again on Wednesday 24th April.



## 2. GOVERNOR SECTION

<u>I'd like to start by saying how delighted I was to attend the Open Morning at the Early Years Class last Saturday morning (and I really was!), but in truth it was my three-year-old daughter who, of the two of us, was by far and away the happiest to be there!</u>

The Early Years Class has outstanding facilities at its disposal, both inside their classroom and outdoors, and a superb staff team dedicated to this class.

Building on the success of previous years, which have traditionally started mid-way through the school year, **from this autumn the Early Years Class will start in September**. (Eligible children will be born between 1 September 2015 and 31 August 2016.) I know that the school is still looking for parents to express interest in places for their children for the September start (details below) - if that's you, or people you know, then get in touch soon!

The great thing about the class is that the days can work to suit your family's needs. There are five compulsory morning sessions (8.45 - 11.45 am, universally funded), and optional afternoon sessions (up to 30 hours of flexible free entitlement). Additionally, the Breakfast Club runs from 7.45 am, and After School Club until 6.00 pm (Childcare Vouchers are accepted here), and there's a chargeable lunch club too.

My son is now in Year 1 at the school, but started his time at John Hampden in the Early Years *Crickets* class, before making a very happy transition to his Reception class the year after. I know he recommends this start to school life! We saw wonderful development in him from the time he joined.

As I wrote earlier, my daughter was extremely interested in all that the classroom and outside space had to offer – that outside space isn't just for play, but provides an outstanding environment for physical development, which is so important in supporting children's academic development too. But let's give her the last word – naturally, we had all the usual refusals to leave when it was time to go, but her final statement on the morning was: "Can I come here?!"

## 3. IMPORTANT MESSAGES

### COMIC RELIEF

Many thanks for allowing your children to participate in this fund raising event. We managed to raise  $\pounds$ 277 for this worthy cause and it was great to see the children looking so 'red' in assembly.

#### 'SMART' WATCHES

A few children have started to come to school wearing watches which have the capacity to take photographs or have games played on them. Please could we ask, in line with our mobile device policy, that pupils refrain from bringing into school anything which has these functions.

### GOODBYE TO MRS REDHOUSE

It is with sadness that we will be saying goodbye to one of our part time teaching assistants. Mrs Redhouse has secured a new professional role and will leave us at the beginning of May. We thank her for all her hard work. Hedgehogs class will continue to have support from Mrs Morrall but she will be joined by Mrs Morgan for the rest of the academic year.

### P.E KITS

During the Easter Holiday we would be grateful if you would check that your child has a complete P.E. kit including tracksuit bottoms and a sweatshirt for use outside when necessary. Your child also needs to have a correctly fitting pair of P.E. shoes (preferably not laces unless they can tie them themselves!) <u>All kit must be named</u>. Children with long hair should have it tied back and anyone with earrings should have them removed at home or be provided with tape to cover them during P.E. sessions.

#### WATER BOTTLES

We encourage our pupils to bring a water bottle into school which can be stored on their table and accessed when necessary. Bottles must only contain water—no juice or squash as this can become very sticky and is attractive to ants!

#### DRINKS IN PACKED LUNCHES

If you are providing your child with a packed lunch please will you ensure you provide a drink too. We are noticing a number of children whose lunch does not include a drink and it is important that children remain hydrated throughout the day.

#### BIKES & SCOOTERS

Children must dismount from their bicycles and scooters as soon as they enter the school grounds. We have had a couple of near misses recently as children attempt to cycle or scoot on the pathways within the school grounds.

#### PARKING ON THE CAMPUS

This is a further reminder that parents should not park in the school car park unless they have made a specific arrangement with the school. Also, please refrain from walking your children up or down the school drive. This is a vehicle only route. The pedestrian pathway is clearly marked.

#### SCHOOL TIMES

Please do not arrive at school before 8.45a.m as this is when the classroom doors will be opened. Children remain the responsibility of their parents/carers until the doors open so do not leave children in the school without parental supervision before this time as staff will not be available to look after them.

#### MEETINGS WITH MRS SPENCER

Just a reminder that Mrs Spencer is available to speak to parents about any non-urgent school related issues. If you would like to discuss any aspect of your child's academic or social development or any issues relating to homework etc. please phone the school office to make an appointment.

## 4. CURRICULUM

## YEAR ONE—TOY MUSEUM VISIT

Year One had a fabulous time last week when two toy makers came to visit. We had a very interesting and funny talk where they showed us lots of toys. They told us how they worked and what time in history they were from. They brought some more old toys for us to look at in our own class rooms. We were able to look carefully at the toys and we all drew one of the old toys. We all learnt a lot!

We also all made a wooden toy. We were given a box of pieces with a picture of what the finished toy looks like. We had to sand our wooden pieces first to make them smooth for us to colour on. We then coloured the toy pieces. The toy makers then helped us to use a hand drill and a hammer. We put our pieces together carefully to make our toys. We then had a lot of fun playing with our toys.

It was a very special experience and we all really enjoyed it. Here are some of our comments :-

I have made an Egyptian horse. It was the first toy to be found and it was found in Egypt. It was 3500 years old—Florence

# 5. PUPIL'S SECTION

Class Council Circle Time is a regular feature at John Hampden. This involves asking the children in each class a set of questions linked to a particular topic or theme. The comments are then collected in and Mrs Spencer takes responsibility for collating the findings and then disseminating them to the staff and pupils.

Key findings from the Class Council Circle Time are then fed into the next School Council Meeting where decisions about the next appropriate actions are taken. This week the theme of the Class Council Circle Time was Behaviour and Safety. Each class was asked the following questions:

1. What does 'safe' mean?

2. Are there places where you do not feel safe at school? What could we do about those places?

3. How well behaved do you think children are around the school? Are there places where

behaviour is better or worse?


- 4. What do we think happens at school when people are unkind? Does it stop them?
- 5. What other things do we think should happen to stop others from being unkind again?
- 6. What is bullying?
- 7. Hands up survey—'Who thinks that they have been bullied at school?
- 8. Hands up if you think you are being bullied now.

Class teachers will follow up the final two questions with any child who indicates 'yes' to either —this is to ascertain whether the behaviour they experienced truly was bullying or whether it might have been better categorised as unkind behaviour. Any child who feels that they may be experiencing bullying now will be supported and we will ensure this negative behaviour ceases immediately.


To avoid tears on the day - please ensure you have completed the paperwork regarding <u>allergies</u> (dairy/non-dairy choices) – we only do vanilla!!

## 7. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

We aim to keep you fully informed of our actions linked to the school improvement plan. Since the last newsletter we have made progress linked to the actions outlined below:

## GOAL A: LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

April is budget setting time for the school and we are in the process of finalising our expenditure for the next academic year. As you are aware the budget situation in Bucks schools is extremely tight. This week members of the leadership team met with representatives from Bucks County Council to discuss the challenges faced by our school with regards to our budget share allocation. There was recognition that our school appears to be particularly poorly funded due to our context and pupil numbers, so the team from Bucks are taking time to consider the best way forward for us.

Staff are consulted when preparing the financial plan and governors hope to ensure that it will support the school in achieving its goals for school improvement in order to enhance learning. Mrs Griffiths, our Finance Officer, takes responsibility for the day to day running of the school finances, assisted by the Leadership Team.



## GOAL B: TEACHING, LEARNING &



The week before the Easter break is 'Assessment Week' and staff have planned to complete a range of tasks and tests with their pupils to measure their progress and to identify the next steps for each child in the key areas of Reading, Writing and Maths. On Thursday 21st March Mrs King ran a meeting for parents of children in Year 1 to explain the statutory Phonics Check for these pupils which takes place in June. We have provided plenty of support materials on the school website under the Parents Section.

On Thursday 25th April, Mrs Barnes will hold a meeting for parents/carers to explain the statutory assessment arrangements that are due to take place with Year 2 children within the month of May. At the John Hampden School, the children are used to being assessed regularly at all stages of their education, and they are always encouraged to do their best.. Whilst end of key stage tests are important in evaluating the success of the school, it is essential that we continue to track the progress made by individuals, groups and cohorts throughout their time in the school.

## GOAL C: PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT, BEHAVIOUR



Class Council Circle Time has happened again this week and it will be followed by another meeting of the School Council. Class Council Circle Time is where each class are asked the same questions and the results are collated. The focus of the discussion this time was behaviour and safety and it has been interesting to note the children's perceptions. Staff are taking note of individual concerns that were expressed during the discussions and supporting these children on a 1-1 basis. Key issues from the Class Council Circle Time will be shared with staff and the School Council who will decide how they would like to see the Leadership Team addressing their concerns.

## GOAL D: PUPIL OUTCOMES

Tracking pupil progress is a necessary part of monitoring in the school. Each term, following Assessment Weeks, staff give a summative assessment level for each pupil in reading, writing and mathematics. This information is used to track progress from one term to the next. It is then possible for us to identify those children who are making below, expected or above expected progress. For any child that has not made expected progress, teachers are required to identify actions they will take to ad-

dress any concerns. This careful tracking of pupil progress helps us to maintain the high standards of achievement we have come to expect at John Hampden.
