

Science: Seasonal Change



Seasonal change	<p>Do carry on with any activities you are doing with your children related to plants and growth.</p> <p>We also look at how the weather changes as we go through the seasons, the fact that days become longer and shorter and what changes we notice outside.</p> <p>Maybe your child could draw or write about the things they have noticed since spring started. They might notice blossom on the trees, hearing more birds, seeing plants begin to grow, lambs in the fields, different smells etc</p> <p>Discuss changes in the weather.</p> <p>They could keep a weather diary. Look at the symbols used on weather forecasts and use the same symbols in their own diary. They might like to record a weather forecast video.</p> <p>They can compare the type of clothing we are wearing now and the sort of clothing we wore during the winter. Why has that changed? They might like to draw and label pictures to go with this.</p>
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	Record sunset and sunrise times to see what happens to the length of days as we head towards summer. (You may need to look these up to help to record as sunset is becoming later!) The BBC weather website has the sunset and sunrise times.
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
