

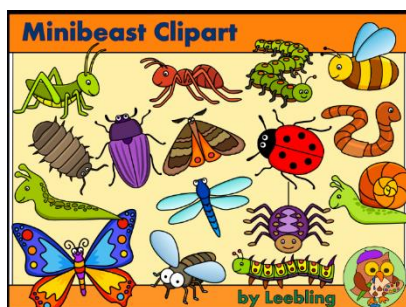
Year 2 Art / Craft - 'Down on the Farm'

Colour

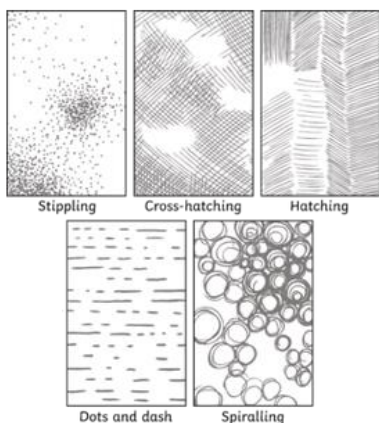
1. Using the colours on a colour wheel , draw one big picture or individual pictures and colour them with crayons, coloured pencils, felt tips or paints etc. for '**Down on the Farm**'. Can you draw and colour a pink pig, a big, red barn, a yellow chick, a red chicken or hen, a green duck, a blue tractor? Make it as colourful as you wish.



2. Using the colours on a colour wheel , draw one big picture or individual pictures and colour them with crayons, coloured pencils, felt tips or paints etc. for '**Minibeasts**'. Can you draw and colour a red and black ladybird, a green and yellow caterpillar, a pink worm? Make it as colourful as you wish.



Optional: You could use your **mark making skills** to be more creative with your art.

Sculpture

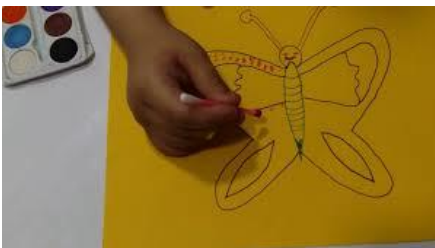
Create your own Farm animal or Mini-beast sculpture. You could get creative here and use a variety of materials to create a 'sculpture', big or small, of a farm animal or a mini-beast. You could use modelling materials at home such as playdoh, plastecine, modelling clay, Fimo etc. Or you could use boxes, or get creative like in the school 'Scrap Shack' and create your own sculpture. Perhaps you can take a photo of your creation.

Get outside and do some **sketching and observational drawing**. Get in touch with Nature and those Minibeasts outside. You could draw some flowers, trees etc. too...



Arts & Crafts

Choose one or more from these Minibeast Crafts:

- Create your own Butterfly Hand Print using paints
- Butterfly shapes - cut out a Butterfly shape from A4 paper and decorate it with shapes or different mark makings (see above for example). Can you make the 2 wings identical?
- Minibeast pebbles - you could decorate smooth pebbles or stones, using paints with minibeasts or turn your pebble into one large minibeast e.g. a ladybird.
- Paper plate butterfly - turn a paper plate into a beautifully decorated butterfly. Maybe you could use pipe cleaners for antennae
- Paper bowl bee - turn a paper bowl into a bee, with yellow and black paints, some plastic, tin foil or paper wings
- Paper bowl ladybird - turn a paper bowl into a ladybird using red and black paint, maybe you could use pipe cleaners or other craft materials
- Create a Fingerprint Minibeast garden
- Paper plate spider web (see attached PDF)
- Handprint picture of the Very Hungry Caterpillar
- Incy Wincy Spider Prop (see attached PDF)
