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1. Message from Mrs Barnes

It was good to see so many of you as you came into school last week for the Learning Review Meetings and the work sharing event last Friday afternoon. There was virtually 100% attendance at the Learning Review Meetings and staff will work hard to catch up with anyone who missed the opportunity to come in and hear about their child's progress and view their learning. We have shared your lovely comment slips with your children who were delighted to hear/read your encouraging notes. The questionnaires have also been analysed and findings will be fed back to individual teachers.

Your continued support is greatly appreciated—our pupils are extremely lucky to have such interested and supportive parents and carers. For our part we try to make the learning opportunities we offer interesting and engaging. From time to time we enrich the curriculum with visits, visitors and special days or weeks. This half-term there have already been a number of activities including:

- Arts Week
- Year Two Puppet Man visit
- Foundation Stage Animal Man Visit
- World Book Day links with Wendover Junior School
- Tennis Workshops
- Drumming Workshops

Some of the activities we offer are free of charge and for others we need to request a voluntary contribution. Unfortunately the school is not in a financial position to fund every type of enrichment activity directly from the school budget share so activities can only go ahead if enough people opt to pay.

Over the years we have consulted with parents regarding their view about voluntary contributions and the best way to collect these payments. Our most recent survey suggested that parents value the extra-curricular opportunities we offer but would prefer to make one payment a term rather than being bombarded with requests for money every time an activity is planned. With the introduction of our online payment system we are now able to itemize the planned activities and provide an associated cost so parents can see how their contribution is being spent.

I would like to take this opportunity to clarify the situation regarding payments for enrichment activities. The activities we book are carefully planned to spread the cost over the school year. The <u>contribution is entirely voluntary</u> and no child will be disadvantaged if their parents are unable to pay or opt not to pay for some or any of the items. Our survey told us that parents/carers appreciated a reminder about making payments as some people said that they did forget to do it even though they intended to. From now on, when sending reminders, we will always make sure we reiterate the fact that any payment is a voluntary contribution. I do intend to send home another questionnaire regarding charging for educational activities in the near future to ensure the feedback we receive is reflective of current opinion.

Captain America or Captain Underpants...characters come to life for World Book Day at John Hampden School

To make a change from writing about the financial crisis facing all of our schools, and which has been in the news again recently (and almost every week since I took over chairing the Finance committee!), I thought I would instead share a thought on a more positive subject...

Last week the UK celebrated World Book Day, and as you can see from the photo beneath the pupils of John Hampden made an excellent job of dressing up as their favourite storybook (or film/movie/tv!) characters.



World Book Day is the world's biggest campaign to provide every child and young person in the country with a book of their own. The aim is to promote improved levels of literacy amongst young people. You will already know from reading my 'Governor Fact File' on the School website that my favourite children's author is David Walliams, and this is because I find his books very funny (Grandpa's Great Escape tops the list!). So do both my daughters, and whether last thing at night or before we head off for school in the morning (or even on the train on the way to school, much to the amusement of the regular commuters!) I endeavor to find 15 minutes to sit down and read with them each day.

But did you know that research conducted recently showed that when parents read to their children they then demonstrate improved behaviour and academic performance at school? And this adds weight to previous research that concluded that children who were exposed to books at a young age have better vocabulary, higher literacy, pay attention longer and concentrate better. So, children who enjoy reading do better at school in all subjects. This is something we all want for our children! You could be wondering why a school Governor is writing about this subject? Well, we now know that reading has a positive impact on all aspects of social and emotional well-being. Reading for pleasure not only improves the academic performance of children – they also enjoy it! At the John Hampden School we believe that children who are happy and who feel valued are in the best position to learn effectively. And effective learning from our children will in turn lead to improved outcomes for them. Our school aims to be a secure and welcoming environment that fosters progress, achievement, aspiration and the social skills to use in a diverse community. As parents, we have a part to play in helping our children on this journey. And one of our key functions as a governing board is to monitor and evaluate the progress that the school is making towards the achievement of its aims, objectives and targets. By reading with our children regularly, we are all going some way towards setting our children up well for the future, which in turn will help the John Hampden School achieve it's aims.

OPEN MORNING FOR PROSPECTIVE PARENTS & PUPILS NURSERY CLASS SEPTEMBER 2019



For the first time ever we are opening the doors of our Early Years Class (Crickets) from September 2019. Learning Review Meetings

Thank you for your feedback following the learning review meetings in early March. This information is in the process of being analysed and fed back to class teachers. At the end of this newsletter you can see the overall feedback percentages from all those who completed a questionnaire following their meeting. We are obviously very pleased with these findings but have also taken on board the verbal and written feedback that was provided. Keeping to time is clearly the biggest challenge for staff because if everyone has just one minute longer than their allotted time there will inevitably be a consequence for people with later appointments. We apologise if you had to wait beyond your appointment time.

MEDICINES

This is a polite reminder that if your child requires prescribed medicine three times a day, this should be administered at home in the morning, after school and again in the evening. We are only expected to administer prescribed medicine that is due four times a day. Or if there are exceptional circumstances. Thank you for your co-operation.

We are hugely grateful to Ross Pedersen (father of two children in our school) who organised a team of RAF Personnel to help us with some Spring cleaning of the school grounds following the building work. They worked tirelessly and we are delighted with the results.

7. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

We aim to keep you fully informed of our actions linked to the school improvement plan. Since the last newsletter we have made progress linked to the actions outlined below:

GOAL A: LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

Each teacher in the school takes responsibility for a specific curriculum area. During the term governors may come into school to observe a specific event linked to their subject area or they meet with the teacher to discuss how the subject is being taught, assessed or developed. At the end of each term subject leaders are required to review the actions they have taken during the term and the impact these actions have had. The governor section of the newsletter often provides an example of this in practice and it is clear that this type of liaison is mutually beneficial and also helps to maintain standards in the school.



GOAL B: TEACHING, LEARNING &



It has been really encouraging to see how well our pupils are responding to the different themes and topics that have been introduced during the year. We have worked hard to try to cover numerous curriculum areas within a topic and the quality of learning appears to have improved considerably as a result. We are very aware that the teaching and learning environment contributes enormously to effective learning and we are working hard to ensure our outside learning areas reflect a similar high quality to that provided indoors. The EYFS curriculum and the National Curriculum guide the content of the taught curriculum but the spiritual, moral, social and cultural aspects of learning also feature strongly in the curriculum to reinforce the ethos of our school.

GOAL C: PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT, BEHAVIOUR

Feedback from the recent Learning Review Meetings has been positive in terms of the satisfaction levels linked to information provided by the school. This is enhanced by opportunities for parents to communicate with their child about what they have heard and seen via individual comment sheets and during the work sharing event. Developing confidence and self esteem is crucial in the early years and children need to be recognised for their strengths as well as being supported in developing resilience and positive attitudes when faced with new challenges.

The continued focus on developing positive attitudes to learning and encouraging a growth mindset is reflected in the day to day observations of pupils and staff at John Hampden.



MODERATION

GOAL D: PUPIL OUTCOMES

Ensuring there is consistency in assessment judgements is crucial. This is true within the school but also across local schools and nationally. John Hampden is fortunate to be a three form entry school because it means there are easy opportunities for staff to work together to moderate their assessment judgements. This week we have worked with staff from other local schools to share writing and agree moderation judgements. Mrs McNally and Mrs Parkinson (County Moderators) are currently making links with the schools they will moderate during the summer term.

PRINCES RISBOROUGH LIGHTHOUSE 2019 - A PLEA FOR HELP!

Lighthouse is a local initiative that provides a week-long summer club full of Christian teaching for local children at the beginning of the summer holidays. The Princes Risborough event is run under the auspices of Churches Together in Risborough (CTR) and has been running for 17 years. It regularly hosts over 500 children and nearly as many teenage leaders, many of whom have no connection with the local churches. The event gets much really great, positive, feedback via the children's parents.

The event only runs through the generosity of local schools, halls & churches in providing funding & loaning equipment and, more importantly, the hundreds of volunteers from young teenagers to those who are much more mature in years. Without their selfless contributions of time the event could not happen.

This year we are facing a major challenge as the Site Manager of recent years will not be available this year. Princes Risborough Lighthouse recognises that the role has grown year on year and we are trying to find a team of volunteers to make up four teams to be involved in physical activity for 2 or 3 days around the time of the event (July 25th to August 4th).

WENDOVER LIBRARY EVENTS

At Wendover Library, we are delighted to announce that this Easter we will be running a special family friendly screening of Mary Poppins Returns on Saturday 13th April in the afternoon. 
