1. Message from Mrs Barnes

I hope you managed to have a restful half term break and were able to enjoy some quality time in the sunshine with your children.

This week the children have been involved in Arts Week. The theme has been 'Oceans' and each class was invited to compete a range of activities linked to this topic. Stimuli have included stories, poems, music, art work and the environment. Today the week will culminate with a whole school assembly where every class will share one aspect of the work they have covered e.g. a poem, art work, a dance, a song etc. Photos will be added to the school website in due course.

We look forward to welcoming you into school next week for the Learning Review Meetings where you will have ten minutes to meet with the class teacher to find out about what the children have been learning and to hear about your child's progress and attainment. The ten minute slot should provide enough time to hear the key messages and you are welcome to spend as much time as you would like looking at your child's books before or after the appointment. We would ask that you do not attempt to take more than your allotted time slot as other people are affected when appointment times overrun. If you require more time it may be appropriate to make another mutually convenient appointment to continue the discussions. You will be given paper handouts relating to the next targets for your child and you may also be signposted to other helpful resources that will be available on the school website. At the end of your appointment the class teacher will give you a questionnaire to gauge your feedback about how useful the meeting has been. We would ask you to complete this whilst you are in school and also to complete a short comment sheet for your child which is designed to motivate and encourage them further.

On Friday 8th March you are invited to come into school again. At 2.45 p.m. you can go to your child's classroom to share their books with them. The purpose of this is to celebrate their successes and to reinforce the messages about future targets. We do recognise that this may not be a convenient time for every parent so we will always make sure that a member of staff shares the books of any child whose parents are not able to attend. (Honeybees and Crickets classes will have a different timing for this event)

World Book Day

Reminder that our World Book Day celebration event is on 8th March. This year we are asking children to come dressed as their favourite character from a book.

Comic Relief

On Friday 15th March, in return for a £1 donation, we are inviting the children to come into school wearing something red . Please note that their clothing must be suitable and warm enough for them to wear outside at playtime.

2. GOVERNOR SECTION

When I became a Governor at John Hampden School Wendover I volunteered to be the SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities) Link Governor. I have a few members of family with special needs which has led me to have an interest in how children with barriers to learning and Special Educational Needs are supported within the education system.

At John Hampden, staff and governors work to ensure that all SEND pupils are given opportunities to fulfil their potential, are fully included within the school community and are able to make successful transfers between educational establishments.

Governors have responsibility for the strategic overview of and the implementation of the SEND Policy. As SEND Governor I ensure that I am up to date and knowledgeable about the school's SEND provision.

I meet regularly with Jo Francis the SEND Co-ordinator who updates me on her work. Miss Francis is incredibly experienced in this area and has a National Award for SEN Co-ordination. As a Governor I am never given any information that would enable me to identify specific children requiring SEND support that is strictly confidential. Jo updates me on numbers of children requiring extra support, funding received for this, different types of interventions and support given as well as the use of external agencies.

Working with Miss Francis has given me great insight into how many different challenges children face as well as the range of different methods used to support the children. Due to the age of children at an infant school Special Educational Needs are often emerging which means Miss Francis works closely with teachers to identify children who may need extra support. Once identified, meeting the needs of SEND pupils requires partnership working between all those involved – Local Authority, school, parents/carers, pupils, children's services, health and all other agencies.

At John Hampden the team works really hard to achieve the best possible education for all children including those with SEND, this was recognised in the Ofsted inspection in October:

'Pupils with special educational needs (SEN) and/or disabilities are very well supported across the school and make good progress from their starting points.' (Ofsted 2018)

3. IMPORTANT MESSAGES

School Uniform

We ask all parents who send their children to our school for their support of the school uniform policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children to school correctly dressed and ready for their daily schoolwork (including a named P.E. kit). Parents should ensure that their child has the correct uniform, and that it is clean, <u>named</u> and in good repair. We currently have Lost Property boxes that are over flowing with clothing that is not named—children are not able to identify whether it is theirs or not!

The Uniform Policy and an order form is available on our school website and gives clear guidance about appropriate clothing for school. Many items can be purchased from the school office.

We wish to discourage parents from allowing their children to wear 'jean' type trousers and we prefer children to wear school type shoes or boots in black, grey or navy.

If any parent would like the school to modify the uniform policy, they should make representation, in the first instance, to the head teacher. The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. If there are serious reasons, for example religious objections, why parents want their child to wear clothes that differ from the school uniform the school will look sympathetically at such requests. Similarly, should an item of school uniform prove problematic for a pupil with disabilities then parents are invited to draw this to the attention of the head teacher. The school will not treat pupils with disabilities unfavourably.

Our policy is based on the notion that a school uniform:

- promotes a sense of pride in the school;
- engenders a feeling of community and belonging;
- is practical and smart;
- identifies the children with the school;
- is not distracting in class (as fashion clothes might be);
- makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- is regarded as suitable, and good value for money, by most parents;
- has been designed with health and safety in mind.

RETURNING TO SCHOOL FOLLOWING ILLNESS

We have recently had a number of children who have been brought into school at lunchtime having been too unwell to come in the morning. On several occasions these children have been given medicine at home to 'get them through' the afternoon but they really should have been kept off for the whole day. It is really important that children are given time to recover properly and if they have suffered from sickness or diarrhoea they cannot come back to school for 48 hours after the last bout of illness. This way we prevent germs and bugs spreading. Thank you for your support.

TISSUES

With such a tight budget situation please can we ask that you provide your child with their own pack of tissues if they have a cold.

COATS

Children should wear a coat to school every day at this time of the year, even though it may appear sunny outside.

SPARE PAPER

We are always very happy to receive any spare paper you may have. In the past parents have donated from their workplaces/contacts, any spare or damaged paper which otherwise would have been disposed of—we will always use it!!

SCHOOL WEBSITE

School websites are an important way of finding out about a school. There is a great deal of statutory information that should be included on a school site but we continue to work hard to try and ensure that ours also gives a true flavour of what the school is really like. Our website is constantly being developed and I would urge you to take a regular look as new information/detail is often added. 4. Curriculum

Discovery Week took place just before we broke up for the half term holiday. The focus of the week was to develop thinking and investigative skills. At the beginning of the week each KS1 class had a maths session with Mrs Barnes where they were encouraged to apply their mathematical knowledge in some active learning. This was followed by the introduction of a brand new resource—Rapid Recall Whiteboards . Each board is specifically designed to allow children to apply and develop their knowledge, skills and understanding across the Year 1 and Year 2 Mathematics National Curriculum. Feedback about the new resource was positive.

'We were given two numbers and then picked which number we wanted to use to work out answers.' Huw

'The activity helped us so that we can find answers more quickly.' Jenson 'It was really fun because you thought you weren't learning but you really were.' Jessica

'We learnt lots of different ways to work out answers to Maths problems.' Tillie



Wednesday was Thinking Day and the children were given the opportuity to learn from each other and to develop their Growth Mindset. KS1 classes were mixed so Year 1 pupils worked with a partner from Year 2. The Foundation Stage classes also joined in and everyone watched 'Austin's Butterfly' (available on You Tube)

Discussions took place as a Circle Time when children were asked:

What did Austin learn?

Who helped him to learn?

Why did he keep going?

What would have happened if he hadn't been told how to improve?

How can we help someone to improve in a kind way?

Then every child produced their own first draft of a butterfly picture before being given constructive tips on how to improve their work by their partner. After that a second draft was produced and more constructive praise and feedback was offered from their partner. This continued until the final version was produced. The butterflies produced will be used to form a display in the school.

Thursday was Science Day where the emphasis was on scientific enquiry/practical science. Each year group chose an investigation to complete which covered the relevant objectives from this term's Material's Unit of Work. Science Day was a great opportunity to make the most of our pupil's questioning and reasoning skills and to draw out deeper thinking through dialogue with teachers and peers. Year 1 completed an investigation to find which material would be best suited to make a roof for a teddy's shelter.

Year 2 completed an investigation to find out which materials were best to use to make a rocket fly the furthest.

Foundation Stage classes enjoyed a whole week of investigating including work on floating and sinking, electricity, slippery slopes, dancing raisons, exploring with magnets and completing an experiment with Coca-cola!

5. PUPIL'S SECTION

As part of our Discovery Week work each class was asked to take on a learning challenge. The children were asked to suggest ideas and then vote for their favourite. The challenge was something that had to be achievable within the time frame by all the children in the class.

On Friday, during Merit Assembly, each class had to present their skill to the rest of the school.

We were wowed by:

Herons Class who sang a whole song in French without looking at any of the words!

Badgers Class who learnt to count to ten in Chinese.

Caterpillars Class who recited a poem, 'My John Hampden Smile' off by heart.

Red Kites Class who learnt an eight verse poem using their own picture prompts to remind them of the words in each verse.

Squirrels Class who learnt the name and order of all the planets in the solar system.

Honeybees class who recited a poem 'This Is My Body.'

Firecrests Class who showed us that they could count to ten in German, Italian and French.

Hedgehogs Class who sang one of our favourite school songs but completely in French.

Ladybirds Class who learnt to count from 1—10 in Greek.

We were so impressed by the skills that were demonstrated and we could see everyone joining in. You might want to test your child and see if he/she can still remember what they learned!!

7. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

We aim to keep you fully informed of our actions linked to the school improvement plan. Since the last newsletter we have made progress linked to the actions outlined below:

GOAL A: LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

As we reach the end of the financial year it is a time to reflect and plan for the future. We still need to make some significant cost savings so the leadership team are looking at how these can be achieved whilst retaining the high standard of education we offer. It is very important that we fill all the places in the school because our funding is maximised if we operate at full capacity. We are waiting for confirmation of numbers for the Foundation Stage classes for September 2019 and we are also working hard to fill our 26 place Nursery from September 2019. Please do contact the school office if you are interested in a place in the Nursery class.



GOAL B: TEACHING, LEARNING & ASSESSMENT



The last staff meeting of the half term was spent moderating writing across the school. The focus for writing throughout the first half of the Spring Term was 'Recount Writing' and laying out a selection of pupil's books from across the school allowed us to identify the continuity and progression of writing skills within this genre. We were pleased to note there was clear consistency in terms of the application of key policies including handwriting, marking & feedback and use of success criteria. This initial look at books will be followed up with further in-house year group moderation and Liaison Group moderation in March. Mrs McNally has been accepted as a County Moderator again this year so we have particular staff expertise in this area.

GOAL C: PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT, BEHAVIOUR & WELFARE



We were delighted with the success of the recent Discovery Week. It was encouraging to observe how far our pupils have come in understanding the importance of developing a growth mindset. So many of them are recognising that effort will lead to success and we are impressed at how well they are starting to reflect and edit their work without becoming disheartened. The impact is that they are becoming more resilient and more open to accepting constructive criticism from staff and from their peers. This is an important skill for them to learn and one which will stand them in good stead in the future.

GOAL D: PUPIL OUTCOMES

Assessment Week

The week before half term was Assessment Week. The children completed a range of tasks and activities to help teachers confirm their judgements about progress and attainment in the core subjects. This week staff have spent time moderating the judgements they have made to ensure there is consistency across the classes within each year group. Learning Review meetings are on 6th and 7th March. Teachers will share with you, their observations and assessments of your child, at this time. They will also hand you a sheet outlining some targets which could be worked on at home as well as in school.

Out of School Care Playworker vacancy


