1. Message from Mrs Barnes

In an infant school, at the beginning of a new school year, I think it is particularly important for the children to be given time to settle into their new classes, getting to know their new teachers and teaching assistants. We have spent time in the first few weeks focusing on the Golden Rules and reinforcing our core values so that all pupils are fully aware of our expectations. I regularly visit the classes during the working day and it is very encouraging to watch the children adjusting to the routines and expectations of school life. We have a positive approach to behaviour management, and our Golden Rules highlight what children should do, rather than what they should not!

We believe it is important to acknowledge when children do well and at John Hampden, this is done in a variety of ways. Feedback from teaching staff is the most immediate method, but stickers and pebbles are also used as reward tokens in many of the classes. Children are sent to me or Mrs Parkinson to share their learning when they have done exceptionally well and we reward this behaviour with special stickers and a gold star to take home. Each Friday we hold a whole school Merit Assembly, in which one child from each class is chosen to receive a Merit Award. This is awarded by the class teacher and teaching assistant for exceptional behaviour or exceptional learning. Children receiving the Merit Awards are invited to sit on special chairs throughout the assembly, and a star is put onto our Merit Board to remind us of their achievement. Our Midday Meals Supervisors also nominate children to receive a special certificate each Friday. A name is picked from a special box and a certificate and sticker is presented to that child. All children who have been nominated will bring home their purple nomination slip and a sticker so you can see what they have done to impress us.

During Merit Assembly we also award the 'Golden Boot' to the class who have most children walking to school (this is measured by the 'WOW Travel Tracker' which the children complete each morning)

Bike It Bears are awarded to the classes who have most children cycling/scooting to school and Mrs Beattie also awards prizes to one lucky cyclist and one scooter rider, chosen at random, from the bicycles and scooters left at school on Thursday lunchtime.

A silver cup is awarded to the 'Class of the Week' So far Badgers, Ladybirds and Squirrels have won the cup -I'll leave your children to tell you who won it today!

Finally, 'The Scroll of Honour' is unfurled. The scroll contains the names of any child in the school who has been spotted by any adult for doing something special. The children are called to the front of the assembly and the whole school sing a congratulatory song to them.

We also like to celebrate achievement outside school and we have a display board in the corridor to showcase the talents of our pupils. If your child is awarded a certificate or an award for swimming, dancing, sport, music etc. we are happy to take a photocopy or photograph and put it up on the board.

Finally, please look out for the letter about the 'Supporting Success at School' letter that was sent out this week. We look forward to many of you joining us on Thursday 17th October from 6.45pm.

2. GOVERNOR SECTION

As the major political parties hold their annual conferences, one topic that continues to create headlines is that of school funding. Despite the extra funding from 2021 announced by the government last month, research this week has suggested that four in every 5 schools will still be worse off next year than they were in 2015, with 16000 schools having less money per pupil in 2020 in real terms than in 2015. Our role as governors includes ensuring that our annual budget is allocated and spent in accordance with our strategic aims, and we work hard with the senior leadership team and the school bursar to ensure that we make every pound count.

A critical area of additional income for many schools is that of 'Sport Premium', and whilst the government hasn't yet published details of the 2019-2020 allocation (apparently they have been busy with another issue) we expect to get approximately the same grant as last year. This government provided additional funding aims to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on the provision of PE and sport in schools. Government guidance on its use includes:

- · Provide staff with professional development, mentoring, training and resources to help them teach PE and sport more effectively and embed physical activity across the school
- · Hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers to enhance or extend current opportunities
- Introduce new sports, dance or other activities to encourage more pupils to take up sport and physical activities
- · Support and involve the least active children by providing targeted activities, and running or extending school sports and holiday clubs
- · Enter or run more sport competitions
- · Partner with other schools to run sports activities and clubs
- · Embed physical activity into the school day through active travel to and from school, active playgrounds and active teaching

We are proud that our school not only meets each of these areas, but we far exceed them. We have built an excellent relationship with Premier Education, a company dedicated to improving the health and wellbeing of children through physical activity. Premier Education support our teachers in providing school PE activities and out of school clubs, and all classes receive at least one session of curriculum PE per week. A team member can also be found each lunchtime offering team sports out on the playground, providing additional sporting activities for the children. Another area where we have invested our Sport Premium funding is in the area of mindfulness, self-esteem and resilience, where we look to help pupils become confident and emotionally resilient. Amongst other initiatives in this area the school has made Yoga available to all pupils. This year the school will continue working with the 'Nurturing Minds' group to help parents who would like to better understand areas of their child's behaviour such as mindfulness, self-esteem, behaviour management and social skills. Evidence suggests that if these areas of a child's personality are well understood and cared for, then they will do better in their educational setting as a result. This funding has also allowed the school to organise several fitness sessions as part of the Health & Safety fortnight initiative, to maintain the School Travel Plan and continue to encourage and incentivise walking/scooting/cycling to school. A Bike It Breakfast is also held regularly, and Cycle training is offered each year.

I could write a lot more about how well the school uses the Sports Premium funding for the benefit of each and every pupil, but I'm only allowed one page in the newsletter! In the face of financial challenges the school continues to use

these additional grants to ensure that our children have the best quality of education possible, and to help promote their emotional and social wellbeing. The school is passionate about providing the very highest level of education and support to the children. Far from being aimed at specific pupils, this extraordinary level of support is 'bespoke to all', and helps contribute to making us such an outstanding school.

4. Curriculum

The curriculum is broadly defined as the totality of a pupil's experiences that occur in the educational process. At The John Hampden School Wendover we have nine aims that underpin the learning opportunities we offer.

- To develop independent learning
- To develop skills
- To learn to value
- To learn to question
- To open up to possibility
- To provide security
- To prepare for life

We try to engage with parents/carers to help support learning and the school website www.johnhampdenwendover.co.uk has plenty of information which you may find useful. Each class has its own section and there is information regarding the current topics included as a link within each page.

We are also providing regular opportunities for school visits/visitors to enhance the curriculum. This week the classes enjoyed a visit in the form of a drama workshop from the Perform Group. The leader was very complimentary about how well behaved and attentive our pupils were.



We are also offering a range of clubs and activities at lunchtimes and after school. You should have received an email detailing the various clubs we are offering this term. Some are run by the teachers and others are run by external providers. You will notice that we are not currently offering these opportunities to our EYFS children as we feel they need to have time to get used to the routines of regular school before introducing further activities for them. Their time will come!!

Helicopter Stories

Helicopter stories is an Early Years, Foundation Stage and Key Stage 1 approach to communication and literacy skills based on storytelling and story acting and forms part of our storytelling curriculum, alongside Talk For Writing. At John Hampden we ensure that the children hear at least one story a day and have the opportunity to learn rhymes and poems. Helicopter Story sessions provide the opportunity to create stories.

In its simplest form, Helicopter Stories lets children dictate their stories which are written down verbatim, exactly as they are told. The children then gather around a taped out stage and the stories are acted out.

Year 1 have all experienced Helicopter Stories with me and as part of their story telling writing unit are recording their stories in special Helicopter Story Books.

Anyone from Year 1 or Year 2 are welcome to come to the lunchtime Helicopter Story Club on Tuesdays at 12.30—1.00 pm.

The Benefits:

An inclusive, whole-class approach which values every child's contribution; facilitates high levels of engagement; creates confidence and self-assurance; supports the development of speaking skills as children express and share their ideas; helps to develop accurate, active listening skills and understanding; supports co-operative and collaborative and creative learning; develops positive relationships within a shared storytelling experience; allows children to explore early literacy and the power of words as they see their stories come to life, and develop their ability to use and adapt language to communicate; offers children a bridge into the world of creative writing as they begin to see the links between the oral stories they compose and the words on a page.
