# 1 MESSAGE FROM MRS BARNES

As we head towards December and the end of the Autumn Term we are all looking forward to the enjoyable activities that are a feature of this time of year in an infant school. This week the rehearsals for the FS Nativity have stepped up a gear and rehearsals for the KS1 Christmas performances are being planned. The parties are being organised and preparations for the Christmas Fayre are well underway. Very soon everywhere you look in the school there will be further signs that Christmas is approaching!

For the Christmas Performances, please note that you will be entering the hall up steps via a side route so please do not even attempt to bring pushchairs into the school. Our pupils and staff work very hard to put on these performances and we would ask you, on this occasion, to make alternative arrangements for all younger siblings as they can find it difficult to sit still and quietly and can spoil the enjoyment for others. Your co-operation would be greatly appreciated.

The Friends of John Hampden Christmas Fayre is next weekend - Saturday 1st December, and I am sure that will really start to make us feel festive—my thanks to all the FJH committee for demonstrating, once again, their amazing organizational skills in the run up to this event. Also thanks to all the volunteers, governors and staff who will give up their time to run stalls—we hope to raise lots of money so do come along and support us. Last year much of the money raised by the FJH was used to purchase and install new Interactive Boards across the school. This time the funds generated will be used to further improve the outside learning environment so we can provide high quality education inside and out in all year groups. We are incredibly lucky to have such an active PTA and we truly do appreciate the time and effort that so many volunteer committee members provide. Many of them are already very busy people and the staff, governors and pupils at the school would just like to say a really big THANK YOU for all their hard work.

**Christmas parties** are planned for **Tuesday 18th December**. We invite the children to come to school wearing party clothes and suitable footwear on that day (the children will be going outside at playtimes so clothing needs to be appropriate for colder weather). We will be asking you to provide your child with their own Christmas party packed lunch on this day rather than the hot meal option and, as this is a special occasion, we are happy for them to have any food which you consider to be appropriate e.g. sweets, chocolate etc.

Each year we are amazed by the wonderful lunches that are provided. Lunchboxes are often specially decorated, some even contain Christmas crackers or other Christmassy items.

The Foundation Stage children eat together in the Octagon and the KS1 children join together to eat in the hall which is beautifully decorated by the Friends of John Hampden. If we are lucky, a very special visitor usually arrives carrying a big sack of presents while the children are eating!

# 2. GOVERNOR SECTION

I've now been a Parent Governor at our lovely school for just over a year, and when I was asked to write a piece for the school newsletter I thought that I would take the opportunity to reflect on this time. If I'm honest, I'm not really sure that I knew what I was letting myself in for when I heard that the Governing Body was on the hunt for new Governors, and I stuck my hand up and said, "I'll do it, if you'll have me!".

The first few meetings were a bit baffling and overwhelming; everyone else seemed to know what they were talking about (which I took to be a good thing!) and I started to wonder if I was seriously out of my depth, and whether I was actually adding anything to the team. I agreed to be the subject link for Music (my favourite subject when I was at school) at that first Full Governing Body Meeting which I attended, and started to try to get my head around it all...

There are three committees which sit underneath the Full Governing Body, and when I became a Parent Governor I was asked to attend a meeting for each in order to see how they operate and decide where I would best fit. After joining the Personnel & Pay Review Committee and the Teaching & Learning Committee, again I heard myself saying "I'll do it!" later in the year when we were searching for a new Chair for the Teaching and Learning Committee.

Fast forward back to now, just over a year after becoming a Parent Governor. I'm still the Governor link for Music, and feel very lucky to have this role. I meet with Mrs Collins at least once a term, and I love her passion to try to embed music throughout as many areas of school life as she can. It also means that I try my best to attend as many school performances as I can, and am always struck by the confidence in our children and their apparent enjoyment in performing. I'm very much looking forward to the upcoming Christmas shows!

I'm also now the Governor link for Literacy, and attended the Curriculum evening for Parents about Reading in September. This was a really useful, well attended event which reminded all of us parents about the importance of reading, and gave some great suggestions about how to make reading at home with your children easier and more fun. After a presentation for everyone, we were invited to join the teachers for each year group who expanded further on ways to engage in reading with our children, and invited to view some lovely displays of books and resources that were age appropriate. What struck me again at that event was the passion and commitment that all of the teachers have in doing their very best for our children.

For me, the best thing about being a Parent Governor at such a great school is actually being able to appreciate the work that everyone does. I'm much more aware of the standards that the teachers are required to reach, and the amount of work that goes into each and every day at school. Aware of the passion and commitment about the teaching and environment for our children, from all the staff and the Governors. Becoming a Governor has involved a steep learning curve, but I am so glad that I put myself forward and was accepted to join the team.

# 3. IMPORTANT MESSAGES

#### CHRISTMAS PLAY TICKETS

Today you will be receiving your allocation of <u>two</u> tickets for the Christmas Performances, if you have requested them. From Monday 26th November we will begin allocating further tickets and you will be able to log on to ParentPay to purchase any further tickets you may require. We allocate two tickets initially to make sure every family can attend. We will issue any further tickets you order via your child's book bag by 30th November.

#### CHRISTMAS CARDS

At this time of the year many pupils wish to send Christmas cards to their friends in the school. We accommodate this by installing two Christmas post boxes which will be in position from Monday 3rd December. One is positioned in the Foundation Stage Octagon area and the other one, for Key Stage One pupils, is positioned near the school office. If your child would like to send some cards this year please would you check the envelopes to ensure the cards can be easily sorted and delivered by our Year 2 postmen.

Each envelope needs to have the name and class name of the recipient clearly written on it.

Unfortunately we are not able to provide parents with class lists, but I am sure your child will remember the names of their very close friends.

We will encourage all children who bring cards into school to post them in the post boxes because the children are always very excited when the Christmas Post arrives in their classroom. ### ADVERSE WEATHER CONDITIONS

If we need to close the school this winter due to adverse weather conditions the following procedures will be used to inform parents.

1. A decision will be made about the school closure by 7.30am. This decision will be based on health and safety grounds, which may include not having enough staff at school to supervise our pupils.

2. By 7.45a.m the school website home page will be updated with closure details. MIX 96 will have been contacted and should announce our school closure at regular intervals throughout the morning. The County Council's website will also list our school closure: www.buckscc.gov.uk

3. If the notices listed above have not been implemented then you are to assume the school will remain open.

4. With these three methods of communication in place, there should be no need for you to telephone the school asking whether we will be open or closed.

5. Should the school open but need to close earlier than 3.15p.m, we will contact you via text or telephone.

Please be assured that school closure will always be a last resort.

It is entirely the responsibility of the parent/carer to decide whether it is safe to travel to and from school in inclement weather and we respect the choices you make. As usual please inform the school by telephone or in writing if your child will be absent from school.

### SICKNESS & DIARRHOEA

Sadly we have had a number of children suffering with sickness in the last week. Please remember that children should not return to school until 48 hours after the last bout of illness. This way we can be sure that your children will not pass on their germs to others. <u>Please ensure we have up to date contact numbers for you and any other emergency contacts</u> as poorly children need to be collected as soon as possible.

### P.E. Kit

Please remember to provide some named tracksuit bottoms and a sweatshirt for your child to wear if they do P.E. outside.

### UNIFORM

As the weather has now turned colder we advise that boys wear long trousers to school instead of shorts because we have noticed, following playing outside at break and lunchtime for up to an hour, they appear very cold.

# 4. CURRICULUM

E-safety is obviously of paramount importance to us and Mrs Shrimpton, our Computing Coordinator, spent time during Safety Week teaching the children about the need to use the internet safely. Following this session we sent home our Pupil Acceptable Use Policy. We would be grateful if you would remember to send back your signed copy of this document it came to you on blue paper!

# 5. PUPIL'S SECTION

# 7. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

We aim to keep you fully informed of our actions linked to the school improvement plan. Since the last newsletter we have made progress linked to the actions outlined below:

### GOAL A: LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

The Leadership Team are continuing to work even more collaboratively with other local primary schools. Mrs Parkinson and Mrs Spencer are both supporting teachers in other schools as part of a 'Side by Side' project linked to school improvement. Local Head Teachers are working together on a joint project which aims to improve outcomes in mathematics. Our Governing Boards are also continuing their joint working party for mutual support and development.

The building project is now finished and the buildings have been handed over to us albeit with a long snagging list! We shared a celebratory assembly with all external partners who helped with the project last week.

### GOAL B: TEACHING, LEARNING & ASSESS-MENT

Subject leaders responsible for the core subjects of English and Maths are required to complete regular monitoring and evaluation activities. Last week our Maths, English and Presentation Co-ordinators, completed their termly work scrutiny of a selection of children's books. This enables us to ensure consistency in terms of presentation, marking & feedback, differentiation and planning across the year groups. The findings will be disseminated to staff and strengths and areas for further development will be shared and discussed.

To ensure consistency of assessments across the local area our staff recently attended Liaison Group moderation sessions where writing from

each key stage was shared and agreement was reached on the age related expectations



### GOAL C: PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT, BEHAVIOUR & WELFARE

We firmly believe that happy children will learn well but it is equally important that we have a happy and motivated team of adults in the school. We are currently looking closely at the data we gained from the annual staff well-being survey and planning actions to address the lowest scoring areas. These actions include individual job chats, snap shot observations of staff at work and professional dialogue linked to wellbeing and worklife balance. We continue to build regular links with Wendover Junior School and there is a determination from the leadership teams in both schools for us to continue in this way. For the pupils it means that there are opportunities to visit one another in our respective schools and an example of this is the sharing of the KS1 and Year 3 Christmas Performances which will take place in the next weeks.

### Last week we received our report from the Government which compares the performance of our school to that of other schools nationally. We have spent time analysing this data and comparing it to previous years and other annual attainment and progress measures. We are delighted to be able to report that the results data from statutory assessments for 2017-2018 has been judged to be well above national figures in all areas-Reading, Writing and Maths. Our Phonics data showed a further improvement and a significantly large number of our pupils achieved a good level of development during their time in Foundation Stage.


