

Dear Parents,

We have provided you with this book to help you to support your child's learning while the school is closed.

This is a list of some things you might like to do with your child:

- Draw a picture- If your child is able they can write a label or caption.
- Tell a story-Ask your child to tell you a story and write it in the book.
- Decorate an Easter Egg picture, challenge your child use a repeating pattern of two or three colours.
- Read a daily story, we focus on Traditional Tales after the Easter Holidays, so it is a good idea to read some of these to your child.
- Sing a daily Nursery Rhyme
- Practice doing zips and buttons independently.
- Using your dice, counter and number line; play a simple game to see who reaches ten first!
- Recite the two Poetry Basket Poems-challenge your child to make up some actions to go with it.
- Sound Safari. Take a walk around your house or garden and listen to all the sounds you can hear. Train your ears to listen carefully to the very quiet and distant sounds!
- Make silly rhyming strings. Bat, cat, hat....
