Risk Assessment

In relation to: Covid-19 (This Risk Assessment should be used in conjunction with the whole school Risk Assessment and is not a stand-alone document) Most people who are infected with Covid19 will experience mild symptoms, such as a cough and a fever, and will recover without the need for specialist treatment. Evidence suggests that children and adolescents are less likely to develop severe symptoms of the disease, but can still transmit the disease to others.

The aim of this risk assessment is to reduce the risk of spreading Covid-19 within the OOSC setting as far as possible, by identifying and implementing measures that will help to keep staff, children and their families safe from infection.

The overarching principle is to reduce the number of contacts between children and staff and all adults associated with the school through keeping groups separate in bubbles and through maintaining distance wherever possible

- Ideally adults should maintain distance from each other and from children when circumstances allow
- Avoid face to face contact and minimise time spent within 1 metre of anyone
- Avoid spending more than 15 minutes within 2 metres of anyone

Prevention - We must always:

- Minimise contact with individuals who are required to self-isolate by ensuring they do not attend the school.
- Ensure face coverings are used in recommended circumstances.
- Ensure everyone is advised to clean their hands thoroughly and more often than usual.
- Ensure good respiratory hygiene for everyone by promoting the 'catch it, bin it, kill it' approach.
- Maintain enhanced cleaning, including cleaning frequently touched surfaces often, using standard products such as detergents.
- Consider how to minimise contact across the site and maintain social distancing wherever possible.
- Keep occupied spaces well ventilated.
- Promote and engage in asymptomatic testing.

In specific circumstances:

- Ensure individuals wear the appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) where necessary.
- Response to any infection we must always:
- Promote and engage with the NHS Test and Trace process.
- Manage and report confirmed cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) amongst the school community.
- Contain any outbreak by following local health protection team advice.

	Minimising contamination of equipment within the setting			
Activities and equipment	All toys, equipment and items required for play and learning experiences will be thoroughly clean between uses and between year group bubbles.	√	√	√

Each year group bubble will have access to outdoor play equipment which is assigned to their group only. This equipment will be cleaned after each use and stored in their group bubbles designated area.		√ 	√
Malleable activities such as playdough, sand and water will be available but strict hygiene regimes will be in place, ensuring hands are washed before and after use. The malleable resource will not be shared across group bubbles and will be discarded after each session.	√	√	√
