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## 1. Message from Mrs Barnes

As we reach the end of the first half of the Spring Term we are already looking forward to what the next half will bring. Learning Review Meetings for Foundation Stage and KS1 pupils have been included in the school calendar and we have noted previous feedback which appeared to show parents would value having more notice of their appointment time. To this end we have sent home the dates and associated times for these meetings. We have asked that the reply slips be returned to school by Friday 15th February, so we will be able to organise appointments and inform you of your time slot as soon as we return after the holiday. The meetings are scheduled to take place on Wednesday 6th March and Thursday 7th March. Teachers try very hard to adhere to the ten minute time allocations. If issues arise during the meeting that need further discussion, it may be more appropriate to make another mutually convenient appointment time, as others are affected when appointments overrun. To give children the opportunity to share their work with you, following your meeting with the class teacher, we would like to invite you into school at 2.45pm on Friday 8th March (this is a change to the date published in the school calendar—apologies)

Parents of children in Honeybees class have received a separate letter about Learning Review meetings and work sharing, in the light of Mrs Shrimpton's current absence.

#### Fundraising Update

Last year we informed parents that our school, along with many others, is currently in a deficit position financially. We requested support from the parent body to help us raise some additional funds and we are extremely grateful to those who have been able to contribute—your donations continue to be well spent but we are aware that we have not provided an update recently. As the end of our financial year approaches we are waiting to be informed of our new budget share for 2019-2020 and we have a meeting with the finance team from Bucks County Council next week, who aim to provide advice and support. Once these factors have been taken into consideration we will provide you with further information about the revised financial forecast. Please see the Fundraising update included in this newsletter which gives information about our plans for spending the money we raise.

#### World Book Day

In the last newsletter and in the School Calendar we have advertised that we will be celebrating World Book Day on 1st March. Sadly this date does not coincide with Wendover Junior School so we are changing the date of our celebration to 8th March so the children from both schools can join together to share books, as we have done previously. So, you have an extra week to organise a costume!! This year we are asking children to come dressed as their favourite character from a book

I hope you manage to have a restful half term break and enjoy some quality time with your children.

### 2. GOVERNOR SECTION

I joined the Governing Board in late 2018, and one of the first things I've been asked to support the school with is their work on what at first comes across as a rather curious acronym 'SMSC': the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of pupils in school.

SMSC has been part of education law in the UK since 1944, and inspected by Ofsted since it began work in 1992. I'll happily admit to needing to learn a lot more about what it really meant when I first heard about it during my first meeting! I found what I think is a fantastic definition, from a House of Lords education debate in 2006:

"...the training of good human beings, purposeful and wise, themselves with a vision of what it is to be human and the kind of society that makes that possible."

It was Mrs Spencer, the school's lead on SMSC, who pointed me to the school's fundamental statements to see how deeply SMSC development is embedded at John Hampden. From the ethos: 'loving to learn' to the aims, including: 'to learn to value ... to learn to question ... to open up to possibility ... **to prepare for life**' – as well as the seven key values, it's clear that our school takes the development of 'good human beings' very seriously indeed.

But what is actually done, practically? Well, there's one particular example that I wanted to bring out here – not to do with how it plays out in the curriculum, but instead the impressive array of **lunchtime and after-school clubs**.

Clubs are linked to SMSC in several ways. This is clear from how Ofsted view things. They state that pupils' SMSC development is shown by their: 'use of imagination and creativity ... use of a range of social skills in different contexts ... willingness to participate in a variety of social settings,' and, best of all their: 'willingness to participate in, and respond to ... artistic, musical, sporting, mathematical, technological, scientific and cultural opportunities.'

Every term, the school sends out to parents (by email) a list of clubs and invites us to sign up our children for ones they'd like to do. In the 2019 spring term alone there are cultural/artistic clubs (art, knitting, street dance, writing), sporty clubs (gymnastics, judo, tennis, yoga), and even French, Lego and board games clubs! Several are run by professional outside providers, and a number by the school's own staff. There are different group sizes, different days of the week, and a number of the clubs are free of charge.

As someone who benefitted from an array of school clubs/societies, I would wholeheartedly recommend the benefits of joining a club to learn something new, and have fun with new and existing friends whilst doing it. Clubs at the John Hampden school are a major benefit to our children,

so why not see if there are spaces left this term, and look out for the list of summer term clubs when it comes round in a few weeks' time.

#### FUNDRAISING FOCUS - SPRING TERM 2018/19

Last term we set the challenge of raising £7,000 for technology and outdoor equipment. Thanks to the dedication of the PTA and your generous support we smashed the target raising an amazing £10,179...THANK YOU!!

The Rocket Fund raised £2,322 for Blue-Bots, Rainbow Easi, Speak Microphones and Easi, Ears Audio Story Headphones which have just been delivered for use by all classes in the school and we look forward to sharing photos of them being enjoyed very shortly.



The remaining £7,857 was raised from fantastic PTA events, parents' generous donations via MyDonate, and commissions generated by Easyfundraising and The Vale Lottery.

This will be spent on new equipment for outside learning including: sand trays, tuff trays, 'small world' toys and large outdoor games; and to ensure safe storage of this new equipment, new sturdy lockable storage units. Again, we will share photos when the new equipment arrives.

## This term and for the rest of the year our fundraising focus will be the redevelopment of the outside areas for Years 1 & 2



As you can see this is a large space, and there are exciting plans to provide zones for the development of fine motor skills, phonics, maths and writing with structures and equipment such as the messy

Final plans are expected shortly, and Mrs Barnes will share these with us as soon as she can; it will be a major development and is likely to be delivered in phases, giving us time to raise the funds required – so watch this space! #### Reminder

## 4. Curriculum (continued)

## **Year 2 History Morning**

On Wednesday 30th January our Year 2 classes had their 'Great Fire of London Day' in school. This term the children learnt all about the Great Fire of London linked to our History topic about 'A significant Event in History'. They found out about Samuel Pepys and London back in 1666 compared to now. After making notes and doing lots of research the children organised the events on a timeline in chronological order. In art lessons, the children made 'burning houses' and painted watercolour silhouettes of the London skyline during the fire. As well as this, the children enjoyed some Great Fire of London yoga and learnt the Great Fire of London rap and performed a 'round' of London's Burning in music sessions. The children seemed to thoroughly enjoy this topic and loved ending the unit with a whole day dedicated to the event.

It was lovely to see so many of the children (and the staff) dressed in costume on the day. The children each did 3 different workshops in the morning. In Firecrests classroom they did some Hot Seating of Thomas Farrynor and Samuel Pepys. They built on their questioning skills, made some comparisons and also had a go being hot seated themselves too! In Herons classroom the children had a drama session where they acted out some of the events of the Great Fire. Finally in Red Kites classroom the children made some Tudor-style bread.

All the staff thought the children behaved beautifully and followed our Golden Rules and values. The whole day was a wonderful experience and we say a big thank you to all the parents who helped to sort costumes and truly embrace the day. Here are some of the feedback comments and photos from the children:

Emily in Herons said she enjoyed doing time lines in her topic book and Bella in Herons said she really enjoyed drawing the picture of Samuel Pepys using the drawing pencils.

Oscar in Firecrests said he really liked making the bread dough and Gus in Firecrests really enjoyed the hot-seating because it was fun!

Hugo in Red Kites enjoyed the drama activity. He acted the part of a soldier, pulling the burning houses down with a fire hook and Amelia in Red Kites said she liked dressing up as a maid from the time and really liked baking the bread.



## 7. SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT

We aim to keep you fully informed of our actions linked to the school improvement plan. Since the last newsletter we have made progress linked to the actions outlined below:

#### GOAL A: LEADERSHIP & MANAGEMENT

It is important that we keep up to date with new resources and learning equipment. On 25th January, Mrs Barnes joined with other Head Teachers from the local schools to visit the BETT & Education Shows in London. We got the chance to see a range of exciting new learning tools and with discounts being offered on some of the products, we have been able to purchase a few new resources which we hope will be effective in developing confidence and fluency in maths.



## GOAL B: TEACHING, LEARNING & ASSESSMENT



The first half of the Spring Term has provided lots of memorable learning opportunities for the pupils in the school—we work hard to make the experiences we offer enjoyable and engaging. The Early Years class have taken every opportunity to get engaged in new learning. Foundation Stage pupils have been inspired by their topic of 'Explorer, Explorer' and so much good learning has taken place. Year One have been inspired by their topic work and have completed numerous investigations. Year Two have found Samuel Pepys buried treasure in the school grounds which led to them learning so much about the Great Fire of London. The whole school is prepared to spend next week developing thinking skills in Science and P4C as part of Discovery Week. Such a lot will have happened in just six weeks and two days!

#### GOAL C: PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT, BEHAVIOUR



We continue to be pleased with the excellent response from pupils to the 'Scroll of Honour' initiative. We are consistently noticing more children taking the initiative to offer help to others or to tidy up or to demonstrate the school values in action without any prompting. We are delighted that a whole range of adults in the school spot this type of behaviour and we hope that this will further enhance the ethos of respect for people and property. The School Council has met and has identified key areas that they consider ripe for development so we are learning things from the various pupil voice activities whilst celebrating the success of those who demonstrate our core values and our Golden Rules.

#### GOAL D: PUPIL OUTCOMES

#### Assessment Week

Next week the children will be busy providing us with further evidence of what they have learned since the last 'Assessment Week' at the end of the Autumn Term. The children complete a range of tasks and activities to help teachers confirm their judgements about progress and attainment in the core subjects. Assessment is an on-going process in our school but these special weeks give our staff and pupils the opportunity to spend slightly longer gathering more evidence to confirm their judgements. Learning Review meetings take place during the week beginning 4th March. Teachers will share with you, their observations and assessments of your child, at this time. They will also hand you a sheet outlining some targets which could be worked on at home as well as in school. assessment
